Working Together for School Success

On that note

Middle school courses cover a lot of ground.

Taking good notes will help your child keep up. Encourage her to write down key points instead of every word, noticing items the teacher emphasizes or repeats. Also, note taking will go faster if she uses shorthand like symbols, abbreviations, or the first letters of words ("&" for and, "imp" for important).

Together time

Spending even a few minutes one-onone with your middle grader each day will help you stay connected. Look for ways to make the time enjoyable. Invite him to show you how to do his latest Frisbee trick, for example, or tell him a funny story from your day.

Meet the staff

Secretaries and other staff play huge roles in running your tween's schooland they can be a terrific resource. Say hello when you're in the office, and encourage your child to do the same. The staff will feel appreciated, and you'll both feel more comfortable asking for help if you need something.

As the new school year gets under way, encourage your middle grader to set himself up for success with these strategies.

Sticking to my routines


Let your tween experiment with routines until he finds those that work best. If he's often rushing to catch the bus, he might set his alarm 5 minutes earlier, then 10 minutes earlier, until his mornings go smoothly. For his evening routine, perhaps

he'll do homework after dinner on days he has sports practices and right after school on other days. Once he has routines he likes, have him write them down so he'll remember them.

Expecting my best

Encourage your child to decide what he expects from himself. Where does he want to improve? He might focus on paying attention to detail if he lost points last year by not filling out science lab reports thoroughly. Or maybe he'll create a plan for spreading out long-term projects so

he's not scrambling at the last minute. He'll gain satisfaction from a job well done when he follows through.




Suggest that your middle grader hang another and use clothespins to clip on assignments or tests he's proud of. Perhaps he'll display an essay on a favorite novel or a self-portrait he drew in art. Seeing his progress can motivate him to keep working hard. €_

Extra worth it

Are extracurricular activities worth the time when your tween has a lot on her plate? Share these reasons for giving them a try.

- 1. She'll get to know classmates and teachers. As she builds sets in drama club, for example, she'll bond with peers who have similar interests. And forming connections with club advisers can lead to networking for the future.
- **2.** She'll learn to set priorities. If her robotics club has a competition coming up, she'll have to organize her study schedule around team meetings.
- 3. Gaining new skills will boost her confidence—and translate into school success. Playing doubles tennis encourages teamwork, for instance, while working on the yearbook helps with writing and editing.





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Responsibility? It's all mine!

Tweens take on more responsibility in middle school. Help your child understand what she's responsible for now and how she can meet her obligations.

Do your work. Teachers might not remind middle graders when homework is due or to hand it in. Your tween should write due dates in her planner and put completed projects by the front door. That way, she will be more likely to complete assignments and take them to school.



Or perhaps a teacher wants finished work placed in a tray. Your child might get in the habit of not sitting down until hers is turned in.

Do your part. When others depend on your tween, it's up to her to do her part. For group projects, she could meet with members to get work done and let them know how her section is coming along. To prepare for a band concert, she may set goals for her practice ses-

sions. Then, at concert time, her performance will be stronger, and she'll feel good about holding up her end.

Mobile

I was in line with my son James at the store when his cell phone rang. He proceeded to carry on a conversation while the cashier rang up his purchase.

After we left, I told James it was rude to talk on his phone while he was being waited on. When he said, "Everyone does it," I knew it was a good time to discuss cell phone manners. I said people tend to talk loudly on their phones, disturbing others and turning private conversations into public ones.

James said he hadn't thought about it that way. He agreed to put his phone on vibrate when we're out and to return calls later. My son can't imagine what it was like growing up without cell phones. But I'm trying to help him understand that just because we have them, we don't need to use them all the time-and that good manners still apply. €\5

OUR PURPOS


To provide busy parents with practical ideas that promote school success, parent involvement, and more effective parenting.

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Reading for pleasure can help your middle grader unwind—and has the added benefit of boosting reading skills along the way. Suggest these two ideas to encourage reading for fun.



Your child could swap books with friends using this interesting twist: Each person wraps a novel in paper and writes or draws clues about it. Everyone gets together and selects a book based on the clues. Then, they open it to reveal what book they have a "date" with.

2. Play reading bingo

Let your tween turn reading into a game by making a bingo card on a sheet of cardboard. In each box, have him write a reading category, such as mystery, science fiction, graphic novel, poetry, and autobiography. As he reads each type, he should X out a matching square. How quickly will he cross out a row? How about the whole bingo board?

 My oldest child just started middle school. Now that she has different teachers for each subject,


how can I partner with all of them?

⚠ To put faces with names, try attending an upcoming event to meet them, such as an open house or a curriculum night. You could also introduce yourself by writing a short message and copying and pasting it into an email for each teacher.

Either way, let them know you want to help your tween succeed, and ask what you can do to support her at home. Also, ask the teachers how they want to be approached (email, phone call, note).

Finally, find out if they want your child to come to them directly before you contact them. A middle school teacher may prefer that a student take the first step if she needs help or has a question.



Individual Event Descriptions

Tug-of-War

WHO: All 5 teammates

LOCATION: East Hill Park Sand Volleyball Court Single elimination tournament, winners advance.



WHO: 1 teammate

LOCATION: East Hill Park Sand Volleyball Court

Person will be required to find 5 specific items from vendor booths. Once all items are found, must return items to sand volleyball court. Item location will be noted by a "Duke it Out" but must ask vendor for item.

Easter Egg Hunt

WHO: 1 teammate LOCATION: Levitt

Person will start at the 50 yard line, will be asked to find as many eggs as possible. Person with most egg wins. All eggs will be located inside Levitt Stadiums fence line.

Base Race

WHO: 1 teammate LOCATION: Homeplate

Time will start with the first pitch thrown, pitcher will continue to pitch baseballs until the person makes fair contact with the ball, once the ball is hit, must run around all bases, time will stop once home plate has been touched.

Chalk Art

WHO: 1 teammate

LOCATION: South side of Levitt Stadium's sidewalk

Loading and Unloading of Students Before and After School

Parent drop off and pick up is on the west (Delaware Avenue) side of the building. Stay to the right and follow the signs. Please pull forward to the blue parking line.

Pulling forward will keep the traffic flowing and will reduce the waiting for other parents dropping off their son/daughter.

The Delaware Avenue entrance is the primary entrance into the building!



Before and after school the streets surrounding York Middle School will become very congested, and at times, can be dangerous. We need assistance from parents to please be patient during this time and help to ensure the safety of our students!

School Hours

Supervision at York Middle School begins at 7:40 a.m. We ask that students not arrive on campus prior to that time. One staff member supervises the cafeteria. Students are welcome to congregate in that area. Once students get to YMS, they are expected to come on campus and remain there. Students enter the halls at 7:50 a.m. with classes beginning at 8:00 a.m. Dismissal is at 3:13 p.m. Students are expected to clear campus and return home as soon as school is dismissed unless they are participating in a supervised extra-curricular activity, staying after school with a teacher, or participating in the YMS After-School Clubs.

On early dismissal days, students must leave campus and return for sports practice no earlier than 3:15 p.m., *unless* the student is involved in an After-School Club.

7th Grade Physicals

State law requires that *all* seventh grade students have a physical examination by a qualified physician. Seventh grade physical forms must be turned into the YMS office by October 31, 2017. If you have any questions, please contact Donelle Ellison, the school nurse, at 362-6655.

ACCESS



All YMS doors will be locked during school hours, 8:00 a.m. – 3:13 p.m. Anyone wishing to enter the building will need to access the buzzer system located at the main, west entrance of YMS. This system will alert office staff. Once visitors have been identified and viewed through the video monitoring system, they will be allowed to enter.

A TOTAL ECLIPSE happens when the moon completely covers the sun. In a total solar eclipse, the sun's outer atmosphere can be seen. This will be the first total solar eclipse visible in the continental United States in 38 years.

It is never safe to look directly at the sun – even if the sun is partly obscured. During the short time when the moon completely obscures the sun – known as the period of totality – it is safe to look directly at the sun, but it's crucial that you know when to take off and put back on your solar eclipse viewing glasses.

While the safety of our students is our utmost concern we will have eclipse-safe viewing glasses for all students and staff. All students will be required to wear glasses provided and will not be allowed to view the eclipse through cameras, telescopes, binoculars, or cell phones. BUS TRANSPORTATION

If you think that your son/daughter will be riding the school bus to and/or from school, you must complete a transportation registration form and return it to the Transportation Department.

The transportation registration form is located on the York Public Schools website.

The Transportation Department will be present at the YMS Open House on Monday, August 14th to answer any questions you may have.

Here are a few important reminders from the health office



<u>Annual school health screenings.</u> Vision and hearing will start right away for designated grades. So encourage your student to wear their glasses or contacts every day all year long. Dental, heights, and weights will take place later. Remember these are basic screenings. See your health care provider if you suspect your child has concerns.

<u>Allergy & Asthma season.</u> Monitor all symptoms closely and follow your health care provider's advice and see your doctor if symptoms aren't controlled. Asthma/Allergy care plans, rescue inhalers, and Epi-pens are a necessity, and may save a life! Contact the school nurse for more information on how we can work together at school to keep student's safe.

<u>Medical Conditions.</u> If your student has a health condition or needs special care during the school day such as medication, treatments or monitoring - please inform the school nurse right away.

<u>Medications</u>. When possible medications should be given at home. All medications must be sent in the original container with proper labeling along with a note from the parent stating how it is to be administered at school. Forms are available in all schools. Students must have parent permission for Tylenol/acetaminophen to be given during the school day.

Students may carry an asthmatic "quick relief" inhaler or an emergency Epi-pen if:

- * The medication has the prescription label.
- * There is a signed parent permission form on file.
- * The school nurse is aware they have the emergency medication.

Students who use the Epi-pen should always report to the school nurse office immediately or if a student uses the "quick relief inhaler" and they do not experience relief.

Feel free to contact the school nurse at any time for questions or concerns.

Start the day off right!

Get a good night's sleep - 8 to 10 hours of un-interrupted sleep.

Minimize noise and turn off phones.

Eating a healthy breakfast – prevents head and stomach aches Breakfast is available for all students at school too.

Dress appropriately for our ever changing Nebraska weather.

Classroom Infection Prevention

Your child's physician can help you determine if your child is able to return to school, however it is important to make sure that they are truly feeling well and able to make it through 7+ hours of the school day. If they still seem tired, pale, with little appetite, not tolerating solid foods, and generally "not him/herself", please consider keeping them home from school. Here are some guidelines to help make that determination.

Students should not attend school if:

- The student has a temperature 100°F or greater
- If antibiotics are prescribed. The student may return to school after taking the antibiotics for a minimum of 24 hours and without a temperature over 100°F while not taking any fever reducing medications.
- The student is vomiting or has diarrhea. The student may return to school 24 hours after symptoms resolve and are able to tolerate a normal diet.
- The student is diagnosed with a contagious disease or condition. (For example, strep throat, conjunctivitis (pink eye), live head lice, chicken pox (Varicella), impetigo, scabies, and pertussis). Please contact your school nurse before sending your child back to school.
- The student has an undiagnosed rash. A rash may be indicative of many things, frequently of illnesses that are contagious. Therefore, a student will be excluded from school until a physician evaluates and determines the nature and contagiousness of the rash. A note is required from the physician upon return to school.
- The student has severe cold symptoms, a persistent cough, a runny nose that they cannot manage by themselves and/or contain with tissues or other symptoms that would interfere with effective school participation.

With viral illnesses, it may take longer before your child is well enough to return to school.

ATTACK ON ASTHMA



Throughout Nebraska schools a protocol is followed for emergency treatment of a student or staff member with **life threatening** asthma or allergic reaction. The protocol steps are designed to provide quick, effective care to prevent death. Certain staff members have been trained to call 911, give an injection of epinephrine and deliver a nebulizer treatment of albuterol to improve breathing. The protocol is a standing medical order that has been signed by the physicians and physician assistants of the York Medical Clinic.

If your student has asthma or a potentially life threatening allergy, it is critically important you communicate this information to our school staff and to Donelle Ellison, RN or Patti Vincent, LPN. The plan and medications you and your physician provide to school will be followed for your student.

Please complete and return an action plan available from York Public Schools or submit the plan your physician provides. Direct any questions to Donelle Ellison or Patti Vincent at 362-6655.

When your child is going to be absent....

When your child is ill and unable to attend school we want to hear from you. Give us a call at 362-6655, option 1, between 7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m.

Please let the office know in advance when your child is going to be absent for an appointment or will be going out of town. For the safety of your child, we make sure all absent children are accounted for!

7th Grade Well-Child Physical

All students going into 7th grade are required to have a well-child physical done by a medical doctor and be current on their immunizations per Nebraska State Law. This also is a good time to have their eyes checked by an eye doctor and see a dentist. Please schedule these appointments over the summer so your student is ready to go to school in the fall. The well-child exam can also be used if your child is going to play sports next year. Please schedule this physical after May 1st. Forms are available in the office or online at http://www.yorkpublic.org under the "Health News" tab. Most students going into 7th grade will need a Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis booster (all in one shot). Please check with your doctor if they recommend other immunizations like Meningitis, HPV or Hepatitis A. These are sometimes recommended immunizations, but not mandatory. Please turn in the copies of the physical and immunizations over the summer or at Back To School Night in August. York does have an immunization clinic that asks for a small donation, but it is not required. You can schedule an appointment by calling 402-362-2566. They are located in the West View Medical Building at 2319 N. Lincoln Ave here in York. If you have any questions, or concerns please contact Donelle Ellison, BSN, RN at 402.362.6655.







For your convenience, our menu is posted monthly on the school website. Lunch and breakfast prices are listed below, along with extra entrée prices and extra milk prices.

School Breakfast

Breakfast is served in the dining areas of all schools before school starts. Please encourage your student to participate in school breakfast. Research studies show that eating breakfast can help students perform better in the classroom.

Stop & Go Breakfast - High school students have the option of selecting this "Grab & Go" meal which includes a choice of 4 entrées daily as well as juice and milk.

School Lunch

School lunch will offer a wide variety of choices for students. Elementary students have three entrée choices daily; Middle School students are offered six choices daily and High School students are offered thirteen choices daily. All meals include an entrée choice, a hot vegetable plus the unlimited Fruit & Veggie Bar, and milk choices.

Chef Entrée - Lunchtime Solutions' school chef will again be visiting to prepare special entrées, giving students an additional healthy, contemporary meal choice. The entrée is available for \$2.25 and students have the option of purchasing the Fruit & Veggie bar & milk separately, or the entrée can be purchased in addition to a regular complete meal.

Extra Entrée - Extra Milk

All Students, at an extra cost, can purchase an additional entrée or milk offered as part of the school lunch program. For example if a student wants a second entrée, or an additional entrée, like a slice of pizza, that entrée can be selected in the lunch line and charged to the student's account. Extra entrees are only sold to students who first purchase a school lunch. Again, all students who purchase a school lunch can have extra servings of canned fruit, fresh fruit, vegetables and salad from the Fruit & Veggie Bar, at no charge. All extra servings of these items are free. If a student is free or reduced they may receive one entrée with their meal but they must have money in their

account to purchase any extra entrees.

School Lunch Account

The District's Lunch Account Policy for the 2017-2018 School year allows students to charge up to \$15.00. When an account balance reaches zero all a la carte purchases will **stop.** When an account reaches a negative \$15.00 all purchases will **stop.** If the student qualifies for free lunch, they still will be able to purchase a school lunch, but no extra entrées will be allowed.

A Point of Sale (POS) software system is used for the school lunch program. Please note the following important information:

- Each student will have his/her own individual Student Account.
- If sending cash with a student, place in a sealed envelope, along with the student's name and lunch account number.
- We are not responsible for lost, unidentified, or stolen cash.

 Deposits should be turned in by 9:00 a.m. at the student's school office.

Lunch Account Deposits must be made <u>before school starts</u>. To insure that your deposit is credited to your student's lunch account on the first day of school, please send your first deposit, for each student in your family, to the office of the school your student attends. Be sure to include your name, your student's name, and your student's lunch account number. Also include any changes in your address or telephone number.

Diet Modifications

Families are responsible for notifying the School Food Service if their child requires a diet modification because of a life threatening disability. A licensed physician must provide specific written medical documentation. Please contact Mitch Novak at 402-363-9169 or mitch@lunchtimesolutions.com for more information.

Free & reduced meal applications <u>may be submitted at any time during the school year but eligibility won't apply until the application is approved.</u> Applications can be picked-up at the administration building, at each school office, or are available online at www.yorkpublic.org. Previous eligibility will carry over to <u>September 28</u>, 2017. At that time, students will revert to paid status until a current Free & Reduced application has been received and approved.

Please feel free to join your child for a meal any day. The cost for an adult breakfast is \$2.15 and lunch is \$3.55. Please pay for your lunch at the school office. We hope to see you there!


