Classroom Happenings....

Kindergarten Corner....

Kindergarten has been very busy! In math we have been learning about the partners for the numbers 3-10, how to draw, write and solve equations and all about three dimensional numbers. We have also spent the month of February learning about the USA. We have been learning about important people, places, monuments and all about the Olympics our United States of America athletes have been participating in. We have been doing a lot of reading at home this month since our Reading for Pennies program kicked off on February 12th.

Second Grade Snippets....

- *Reading If your child has not completed their AR goal of reading 6 books this quarter, they have until March 6th to make their goal. Keep reading!!
- *Math- Students have been learning about telling time and making picture graphs and bar graphs. Next up, they will go back to work on 3-digit adding and subtracting.
- *Science We are finishing up our unit on food groups. Then we will begin our ever popular unit on reptiles and dinosaurs. Students will learn about different types of dinosaurs, fossils, and discuss theories on why dinosaurs became extinct. If you really want to impress your 2nd grader, try out this joke!

Fourth Grade Fun....

February is Poetry month in 4th grade. Fourth graders are choosing a poem of their choice and memorizing it for recitation.

Fabulous Fifth Grade

Fifth graders are starting 2018 with many learning adventures. In Language Arts, they are focusing on parts of speech including prepositions, pronouns, and adjectives. They finished their science unit on the Sun, Moon, and Stars, focusing mostly on the changing phases of the moon. In their next unit, they will be interacting with forces. Students will figure out what causes things to move and why. Comprehension, skill development, and vocabulary building continue to be fifth graders' goals in Reading. Students finished a division unit in Math and will be learning about algebraic expressions, patterns, and coordinate graphing next. They will be writing another personal narrative in Writing, using the Quick Sketch/Quick Notes template to plan their writing. In Social Studies, students have been learning about the American Revolutionary War. They have examined the many causes that led the 13 Colonies to want to break away from England. They have also learned about taxes and how different they are today from the 1770s.



Start every day the wholegrain way. Serve whole-grain versions of cereal, bread, tortillas, or pancakes at breakfast. Whole grains give your kids B vitamins, minerals, and fiber to help them feel full longer so they stay alert to concentrate at school.



Check the Ingredients List:

Take a few seconds to see if the food is made from whole grains. Look for the word "whole" before the first ingredient. Some examples of whole-grain ingredients are:

- whole wheat
- brown rice
- oatmeal
- quinoa
- whole-grain corn
- buckwheat

- bulgur
- graham flour
- rolled oats
- whole-grain barley
- whole rye
- wild rice
