### **Classroom Happenings**

### Kindergarten

Kindergarten students have been counting the number of days we have come to school, through our student-led daily math routines. On Wednesday, January 23, they celebrated their 100th day of school! How exciting to be 100 days smarter! Their 100 collections brought for Show and Tell were great!

In Reading, we continue to blend more and more of our letter sounds to read words. Those words create the sentences in our daily sight word readers. On February 12th, a visit from Abraham Lincoln will kick off our home reading program called, "Reading for Pennies".

We continue to look forward to our time with our 5th grade Kinderpals each week, as well as the mix of all Kindergarten students during our weekly Kinderblender time.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

We are into our 3rd quarter AR reading goal. Remember, students need to pass 6 AR tests in their level to earn an ice cream party at the end of the quarter! In math, we will finish working on subtraction and word problems and start our unit on telling time and graphs. For writing, we will work on opinion writing and using good reasons to persuade someone to think a certain way. We have started our body systems unit in science. The students are enjoying learning about the organs that belong in different systems and what they do for our body. If you are ever looking for things to do at home with your child, try having them count spare change. Money is something that we touch on a few times throughout the year, but what an important life skill to have! We truly appreciate your effort in attending Parent Teacher Conferences this month!

### 4th Grade

In fourth grade, we have been focusing on figurative language. It makes our writing more exciting! Ask your fourth grader about similes, metaphors, alliteration, onomatopoeia, personification, and idioms. We are also working on personal narratives in writing. Students are practicing writing stories about their lives. They are using quick sketches and quick notes to plan out their stories. We hope that students will use their figurative language knowledge in their writing.

### Preventing the Flu: Good Health Habits Can Help Stop Germs



The **single best way to prevent seasonal flu is to get** <u>vaccinated</u> each year, but good health habits like covering your cough and washing your hands often can help stop the spread of germs and prevent respiratory illnesses like the flu. There also are <u>flu antiviral</u> <u>drugs</u> that can be used to treat and prevent flu.

### 1. Avoid close contact.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.

### 2. Stay home when you are sick.

If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. This will help prevent spreading your illness to others.

### 3. Cover your mouth and nose.

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.

### 4. Clean your hands.

Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.

### 5. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.

Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.

### 6. Practice other good health habits.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.
