FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE —

Important Day for all YHS Students

April 2nd is a very important day for all York High School students. Attendance is required at every event. All juniors, sophomores and freshman must be at YHS by 8:00 a.m. All seniors must be at the Holthus Convention Center by 8:00 a.m.

- Seniors Real World Boot Camp @ Holthus Convention Center
- Juniors ACT Test @ YHS
- Sophomores Practice ACT Test @ YHS
- Freshman College Visit

Real World Boot Camp – YHS seniors will participate in a number of stations focused on topics they will encounter after high school. Some of the panels include – personal finance, basic auto maintenance, laundry/basic cleaning, and healthy lifestyles.

ACT and Practice ACT – Juniors and Sophomores will be at YHS taking the ACT test. For juniors, this is a mandatory test required by the Department of Education. Sophomores will take a practice ACT to get ready for their junior year. The ACT has five tests – English, Math, Science, Reading, and Writing. When students are done testing they will be dismissed from school.

College Visit – All 9th grade students will visit Central Community College in Hastings. Students will tour the campus, look at various programs offered, and eat in the cafeteria (YHS pays for food).

SUMMER DRIVER'S EDUCATION DATES

We are planning on offering summer driver's education again this summer. We will be offering <u>2 sessions</u>. Both sessions will be from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Our first session will run from **Monday**, **June 3rd through Thursday**, **June 6th**. The second session will run from **Monday**, **June 10th through Thursday**, **June 13th**. Students must have a permit (Learners or School permit) by August 1 to be able to complete the driving portion of the

COUNSELING CENTER NEWS

HONORS NIGHT/SENIORS AND PARENTS

Honors Night will be held on Monday, April 15, at 7:00 p.m. If your student has received college scholarships and/or is planning to go into the **MILITARY (including National Guard)**, please let us know so we can include them in our program. Colleges and other organizations do <u>not</u> always let us know about these and we want to honor those students for their accomplishments.

AFTER HONORS NIGHT

After Honors Night, seniors will be sent important information on how to collect their scholarship funds. An e-mail will be sent to each student via their <u>personal</u> email. (If a parent wishes to also receive this e-mail, please notify Deb Stuhr at <u>deb.stuhr@yorkdukes.org</u> requesting this.) Most scholarships are paid per semester, <u>so it's important to hold onto these contacts through second semester because</u> <u>students will be asked to submit information to these committees again.</u> If you do not receive the information in a few weeks, please let the counseling office know.

Students are also required to promptly write a thank you note for each scholarship received. The notes are provided by the Counseling office, but postage must be handled by your student.

REMINDER: SUMMER SCHOOL CLASSES FOR CREDIT RECOVERY

Summer school classes for credit recovery will be offered at the Enrichment Center again this year. This is only through the month of June for students who are at risk of not meeting York High School graduation requirements. Space is limited and priority will be given to first semester failures. There is a fee for attending summer school. A letter will be sent out to parents with at-risk students later in April explaining the process to follow if you want your child to take a class. If you have questions, please feel free to contact your child's counselor as soon as possible.

2019-2020 SENIORS

If you are considering college and plan to apply for scholarships, we encourage you take the June and/or July ACT test. Fee waivers for the June and July tests are available until the regular registration deadline of May 3/June 14. ACT scores from tests taken in the junior year are used for Regents scholarship competition. Seniors have three chances (September, October and December) to better their scores for scholarships and college entrances (UNL, UNK and UNO require a score of 20). Many scholarships have very early deadlines (example: Horatio Alger – October 31) so taking those earlier tests ensures scores will be available when needed.

FEE WAIVERS

Cost should never be a deterrent when it comes to college opportunities. If this is an issue for your child, please take full advantage of fee waivers available through the ACT, SAT or the NAIA and NCAA. These are available for our students who qualify for free or reduced lunches. If you would like to know if you qualify or just want to pick up a waiver, you or your student needs to come to the counseling office.

NAIA AND NCAA REGISTRATION

If you want to play sports in college, you will need to register with the NAIA (fee is charged) or the NCAA, depending on the college you wish to attend. These two organizations require ACT scores sent directly from the ACT testing center so you will need to include the NAIA code (9876) or the NCAA code (9999) in your choices of where you want your scores sent. If scores need to be sent later, there is a fee for each score sent. *Please also be sure Mrs. Stuhr is aware of your college sport participation so your final transcript gets sent to these entities.*

Sophomore and junior parents are invited to a meeting on Wednesday, April 10, beginning at 6:00 PM about scholarships and "what's new" for 2019-20! (This meeting should last about 30 min.)

INCOMING FRESHMEN – PARENT MEETING

We look forward to welcoming eighth graders from YMS, Emmanuel-Faith and St. Joseph's for an orientation/tour to YHS on Wednesday, April 17, in the afternoon. On that same date, there will be a parent meeting at 5:30 p.m. for eighth grade parents and students in the high school theater. At this meeting, academic planning, credits, dual credit opportunities, etc. will be discussed. We highly encourage parents and students to attend. A letter will be sent to all with details.

JUNIORS STATE-WIDE ACT and SOPHOMORES PRACTICE ACT

As you are probably aware and have heard by now, <u>all YHS juniors</u> will take the ACT test at York High School on Tuesday, April 2. The sophomores will also be at YHS taking a practice ACT. They will report to school between 7:30-8:00 AM.

<u>ON TO COLLEGE – TEST PREP</u>

Any student who wishes to have the ability to study/prepare for the ACT with the On To College online program may pay YHS \$75. This fee covers the registration fee. YHS will then give the student the log in information to use according to his/her schedule for test-taking preparation and tips. Contact the Counseling office with questions.

COLLEGE CAMPUS VISITS AND REAL WORLD LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Our final college campus visit for this school year is planned for Tuesday, **April 2**, and this will be for our freshmen students. **All freshmen** will visit the campus of Central Community College and Hastings College. Information is sent to the parents of each student. If you have questions, please call the Counseling office.

Also on **April 2, all seniors** will participate in our Real World Leadership Academy. Seniors will go to the Holthus Convention Center and participate in business and finance sessions as well as basic auto maintenance, insurance, loans and get feedback from alumni.


