Short Stops

Take good risks

Encourage your tween to try an activity that appeals to her, even if she's a little nervous. Maybe she wants to join the cross-country team but hasn't run longer distances. Or perhaps she's interested in the improv club but is hesitant about public speaking. Stepping out of her comfort zone will stretch her abilities and build confidence.

Agree to disagree

If your usually agreeable child starts poking holes in your opinions, that's a sign his reasoning skills are developing. Try not to take it personally, and ask him to share his views respectfully. He'll learn that it's okay to disagree, as long as he's polite about it.

Puzzle me this

Crossword puzzles boost your tween's vocabulary. Have her print free puzzles she finds online or get crossword books from a dollar store. Or she and her friends could make crosswords for each other on graph paper or with a website like puzzlemaker.discoveryeducation.com.



A good attitude = more learning

Starting the year with a positive attitude about school goes a long way toward a student's success. Inspire your tween to develop a winning outlook with these strategies.

Look for positives

Your middle grader can find something interesting about every class. Suggest that he start a list of fun facts, one from each class every week. After a biology lesson on genetics, he might write, "I had a 50 percent chance of having blue eyes since Mom's are brown and Dad's are blue." Encourage him to share his discoveries with you.

Celebrate achievements

Tell your tween to congratulate himself on a job well done. Maybe he earned a higher score on this week's vocabulary quiz than he did on last week's. Or perhaps he picked a topic for his history paper, even though he was tempted to



put off getting started. Saying "I did it!" will make him feel good about himself and motivated to keep working hard.

Seek help


Successful students know how to get help when they face challenges. For example, your child could post a schedule of teachers' office hours or homework-help sessions in his locker. Then if he's struggling, he can sign up for a slot. Having a plan in place will help him stay upbeat. 🍊

Fall family fun

Strong parent-tween relationships help kids resist risky behaviors and make family life more enjoyable. Try these ideas.


■ **Outings.** Ask your child to find outings that sound fun, such as a fall festival or a paint night. For ideas, she could look in the newspaper or check library and community center websites. *Tip:* Suggest that she ask classmates where their families like to go on weekends.

■ **Projects.** Let your middle grader plan family projects. Perhaps she'll suggest a garage sale. Work together to gather books, housewares, and toys you don't need anymore. She can help to advertise the sale, price items, and greet customers. 🍊



Wanted: Involved parents

What does parent involvement look like in middle school? While you probably won't be volunteering in your child's classroom, she still wants your support (even if she doesn't act like she does). Consider these tips for being a partner in her education.




At school. Make it a priority to attend school events like curriculum nights and school plays. Also, look for ways to help that are related to your tween's activities. If she plays in the band, you could volunteer to set up for a concert. If she belongs to a book club, you might offer to shelve library books and talk to her afterward about

books you noticed. Or if she's an athlete, maybe you'll work at the concession stand during sporting events.

At home. Offer to quiz your middle grader on material she's studying or to look over a paper she's working on. To stay in the loop about what's happening in school, read the website regularly and sign up for email or text alerts. Mention the announcements to your child so she knows you're interested in her school. 👍

Q & A Getting started with community service

Q My son is required to complete community service hours this year, but he can't decide what to do. How can I help him?



A Doing community service will let your son help others and gain work experience. The main office or his school counselor may have a list of places where he can volunteer. He could also ask friends, relatives, and neighbors for ideas.


Then, suggest that he choose a job that matches his interests—he'll get more out of it that way. For example, he might participate in a beach cleanup if he's concerned about the environment. Or if he likes working with younger children, he may play games or read with little ones at a homeless shelter while their parents attend job training.

Finally, encourage him to keep track of his work, including names of supervisors, so he'll receive credit—and even have references for a job someday. 👍

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Everyday engineering

From shoes and clothing to appliances and electronics, just about every product your tween uses was designed by engineers. Help him discover how engineering affects his daily life with this activity.

1. Encourage your child to consider the engineering involved in his favorite products. Maybe his running shoes absorb impact, the smoothie maker purees big chunks of fruit, or his jacket repels rain.

2. Now let him pick a product to redesign. He could decide to add another layer of foam to his shoes. First, he should run a block and rate his comfort on a scale of 1–10. Then, he can add foam, run another block, and rate his comfort again. What happens if he adds even more foam? How much might be too much? 👍

The “elevator speech”


When I was looking for a job, I discovered an interesting technique for “selling” yourself in an interview: the “elevator speech.” I shared the idea with my daughter Susan, thinking she could use it to write summaries or make points during class discussions.

I told Susan to pretend she was going to ride an elevator with me and summarize the novel she's reading in

30 seconds or less—about the time it would take to ride from the ground to the top floor of a building.

Susan jotted down what she wanted to say. At first, it took her almost 3 minutes to read it. But she kept trimming her summary until it was about 30 seconds long.

Then, she read it aloud to me. She got to the point quickly, and now she plans to try the strategy in class. 👍

Loading and Unloading of Students Before and After School

Parent drop off and pick up is on the west (Delaware Avenue) side of the building.
Stay to the right and follow the signs. Please pull forward to the blue parking line.
Pulling forward will keep the traffic flowing and will reduce the waiting
for other parents dropping off their son/daughter.



Before and after school the streets surrounding York Middle School will become very congested, and at times, can be dangerous. We need assistance from parents to please be patient during this time and help to ensure the safety of our students!

School Hours

Supervision at York Middle School begins at 7:40 a.m. We ask that students not arrive on campus prior to that time. One staff member supervises the cafeteria. Students are welcome to congregate in that area. Once students get to YMS, they are expected to come on campus and remain there. Students enter the halls at 7:50 a.m. with classes beginning at 8:00 a.m. Dismissal is at 3:13 p.m. Students are expected to clear campus and return home as soon as school is dismissed unless they are participating in a supervised extra-curricular activity, staying after school with a teacher, or participating in the YMS After-School Clubs.

On early dismissal days, students must leave campus and return for sports practice no earlier than 3:15 p.m., **unless** the student is involved in an After-School Club.



7th Grade Physicals

State law requires that **all** seventh grade students have a physical examination by a qualified physician. Seventh grade physical forms must be turned into the YMS office by October 31, 2019. If you have any questions, please contact Sue Arnold, the school nurse, at 362-6655.

The fall middle school athletic season is just around the corner. Football and Volleyball practice will begin on **Monday, August 19.**


YMS NEWS

ATTACK ON ASTHMA

Throughout Nebraska schools a protocol is followed for emergency treatment of a student or staff member with **life threatening** asthma or allergic reaction. The protocol steps are designed to provide quick, effective care to prevent death. Certain staff members have been trained to call 911, give an injection of epinephrine and deliver a nebulizer treatment of albuterol to improve breathing. The protocol is a standing medical order that has been signed by the physicians and physician assistants of the York Medical Clinic.

If your student has asthma or a potentially life threatening allergy, it is critically important you communicate this information to our school staff and to Sue Arnold, RN or Patti Vincent, LPN. The plan and medications you and your physician provide to school will be followed for your student.

When your child is going to be absent....

When your child is ill and unable to attend school we want to hear from you. Give us a call at 362-6655, option 1, between 7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m.

Please let the office know in advance when your child is going to be absent for an appointment or will be going out of town. **For the safety of your child, we make sure all absent children are accounted for!**

7th Grade Well-Child Physical

All students going into 7th grade are required to have a well-child physical done by a medical doctor and be current on their immunizations per Nebraska State Law. This also is a good time to have their eyes checked by an eye doctor and see a dentist. Please schedule these appointments over the summer so your student is ready to go to school in the fall. The well-child exam can also be used if your child is going to play sports next year. Please schedule this physical after May 1st. Forms are available in the office or online at <http://www.yorkpublic.org> under the "Health News" tab. Most students going into 7th grade will need a Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis booster (all in one shot). Please check with your doctor if they recommend other immunizations like Meningitis, HPV or Hepatitis A. These are sometimes recommended immunizations, but not mandatory. Please turn in the copies of the physical and immunizations over the summer or at Back To School Night in August. York does have an immunization clinic that asks for a small donation, but it is not required. You can schedule an appointment by calling [402-362-2566](tel:402-362-2566).

They are located in the West View Medical Building at 2319 N. Lincoln Ave here in York.

LUNCH APPLICATIONS

Free and reduced price lunch applications are available in your student packet or online. If you wish to apply, please complete the form and either send it to school with your son/daughter or mail the application to the Superintendent's Office. An application must be completed for ***each new school year***. If your child/children qualified for free or reduced price meals at the end of last school year, you must submit a new application by **September 26, 2019** in order to avoid an interruption in meal benefits.

ALL APPLICATIONS WILL BE KEPT IN STRICT CONFIDENCE!

Students will not be able to charge a lunch when their account balance is below negative \$15.00. A sack lunch may be brought from home. It is the student's responsibility to inform parents when the account is getting low. Both verbal and message reminders will be provided to students when their account balance is low. We welcome calls to check on the balance of your child's lunch account or you may check on the YPS Parent Portal website. Please keep in mind that extra entrees and a la carte items can only be purchased if funds are available in individual accounts.

MAKING AN ONLINE LUNCH PAYMENT THROUGH INFINITE CAMPUS

- Visit our website at www.yorkpublic.org
- Under "Parents" click on "Parent Portal" and log into your Infinite Campus Parent Portal
 - * If you don't have a parent portal account, contact your student's school office and they will set up an account for you. If you have students in multiple schools, you do not need multiple portal accounts as all students should show up on your login screen. If not, let the office know and they will make a simple adjustment.
- Click on "Payments" in the left column
- Add the amount of money you'd like to deposit into your student's account in the 'payment' box beside their name- minimum amount is \$5.00. Click "Continue" ****Notice there is a convenience fee of \$2.25 per transaction for online payments.** If you have multiple students in your family, you may add money to all of their accounts at the same time with one transaction.
- Choose the method of payment that you would like to use. Select "Add" if this is your first time using the online payment process. Add your payment method- **by using your checking or savings account instead of a credit or debit card, you will be helping YPS save money with no credit card fees;** click "Save" and then click "Back to Payments"
- Confirm that everything looks correct on the screen
- Click "Make Payment"
- Print a receipt if you would like
- Your student has lunch money!

Breakfast is served in the dining areas of all schools before school starts. Please encourage your student to participate in school breakfast. Research studies show that eating breakfast can help students perform better in the classroom.

Stop & Go Breakfast - High school students have the option of selecting this "Grab & Go" meal which includes a choice of 4 entrées daily as well as juice and milk.

School Lunch

School lunch will offer a wide variety of choices for students. Elementary students have three entrée choices daily; Middle School students are offered six choices daily and High School students are offered thirteen choices daily. All meals include an entrée choice, a hot vegetable plus the unlimited Fruit & Veggie Bar, and milk choices.

Chef Entrée - Lunchtime Solutions' school chef will again be visiting to prepare special entrées, giving students an additional healthy, contemporary meal choice. The entrée is available for \$2.25 and students have the option of purchasing the Fruit & Veggie bar & milk separately, or the entrée can be purchased in addition to a regular complete meal.

Extra Entrée – Extra Milk

All Students, at an extra cost, can purchase an additional entrée or milk offered as part of the school lunch program. For example if a student wants a second entrée, or an additional entrée, like a slice of pizza, that entrée can be selected in the lunch line and charged to the student's account. Extra entrees are only sold to students who first purchase a school lunch. Again, all students can have extra servings of canned fruit, fresh fruit, vegetables and salad from the Fruit & Veggie Bar, at no charge. All extra servings of these items are free. If a student is free or reduced they may receive one entrée with their meal but they must have money in their account to purchase any extra entrees.

School Lunch Account

The District's Lunch Account Policy for the 2019-2020 School year allows students to charge up to \$15.00. When an account balance reaches zero all a la carte purchases will **stop**. When an account reaches negative \$15.00 all purchases will **stop**. If the student qualifies for free lunch, they still will be able to purchase a school lunch, but no extra food items will be allowed.

A Point of Sale (POS) software system is used for the school lunch program. Please note the following important information:

- Each student will have his/her own individual Student Account.
 - If sending cash with a student, place in a sealed envelope, along with the student's name and lunch account number.
 - We are not responsible for lost, unidentified, or stolen cash.
- Deposits should be turned in by 9:00 a.m. at the student's school office.

Lunch Account Deposits must be made before school starts. To insure that your deposit is credited to your student's lunch account on the first day of school, please send your first deposit, for each student in your family, to the office of the school your student attends. Be sure to include your name, your student's name, and your student's lunch account number. Also include any changes in your address or telephone number.

Diet Modifications

Families are responsible for notifying the School Food Service if their child requires a diet modification because of a life threatening disability. A licensed physician must provide specific written medical documentation. Free & reduced meal applications may be submitted at any time during the school year but eligibility won't apply until the application is approved. Applications can be picked-up at the administration building, at each school office, or are available online at www.yorkpublic.org. Previous eligibility will carry over to **September 27, 2019**. At that time, students will revert to paid status until a current Free & Reduced application has been received and approved.
