Hello York Middle School Parents and Students. I am extremely excited to begin my seventh year as principal of York Middle School.

Here are a few things you need to know about YMS!

- We have the Best Middle School in Nebraska.
- We have an outstanding staff that is dedicated to the growth of young men and women not only academically but physically, emotionally, and socially.
- We have students who give a great effort and have a strong character.
- We have a school district that is focused on students and strives to constantly improve.
- We thrived last year during a year that was anything but normal. Even though this year has its
 uncertainties, one thing remains the same, we want your students to have a safe and successful
 school year.
- We are still in a Global Pandemic and we are constantly working with our local health departments and medical personnel to make YPS the safest it can be. Below is a letter from Superintendent Dr. Bartholomew.

Once we dismissed school, YPS moved to our "green" tier for all buildings and summer school programs and we will start the 2021-22 year in our green tier. Here are the main components of our green tier -

- Masks are optional for students and staff.
- Consistent cleaning of high touch surfaces.
- Promote good hygiene and hand washing at school and home.
- Consistent changing of HVAC air filters.
- Utilization of bipolar ionization machines installed in all buildings to kill a high percentage of airborne viruses.

One of the advantages of our tiered Return to School plan is it allows us to adjust if necessary. For example, if we would begin to see community spread like we did last year, we would **consider** making lunch room adjustments, postponement of large indoor, non-extracurricular activities (assemblies), or requiring masks for a period of time. I understand there continues to be a lot of controversy about masks. If we would need to make that requirement, it could be for a short period of time. One example is if we have a cluster in one of our elementary grades. We might need to isolate that group for a short period of time and possibly require masks in that room to help prevent any spread. My hope is we don't have to make that requirement, but I want to be honest and transparent that it could happen.

Much like one year ago, there are many unknowns going into the 2021-22 school year. Schools are receiving contradictory information on a daily basis from a variety of sources. As new information becomes available, YPS will continue to evaluate and determine what is best for our students, staff, and families. The entire team at York Public Schools appreciates all the support we have received and we are excited to get the new school year started. Dr. Bartholomew

If you have any questions concerning our safety protocols or concerns about your child do not hesitate to ask.

The middle school experience is both an exciting and anxious time for students, especially new students to the building. During this crucial time in the life of adolescents, they are searching for more independence, more responsibility, and new experiences. They are learning how to control and express emotions. They are more self-conscious about the physical changes occurring to their bodies. Rest assured your child has a committed administration, faculty, and staff at YMS in supporting each and every child to ensure all individual potential is reached.

PBiS at YMS- PBiS stands for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports. Last year we began this program to promote positive behaviors at YMS. Along with promoting positive behaviors we teach and expect students to be Safe, Respectful and Responsible. This is <u>The Duke Way</u>. Students are rewarded and taught behavior expectations throughout the school. We had a successful start to this process but we are going to strive to improve.

What can I control?- These three short years at YMS are full of changes for students both physically, emotionally, socially as well as academically. Two constants that everyone can control is your attitude & effort. I want all students to come to school each day knowing that if they choose a positive attitude and give a great effort, they will have had a successful day. Parents thank you for encouraging your middle school child to choose a positive attitude & give a tremendous effort each day!

Safety— In this newsletter, you will find information concerning the arrival, departure, parental pickup and drop-off of students. Please have a conversation with your child about safety during this time. Students walking or riding bicycles to and from school are encouraged to be aware of their surroundings, cross streets at appropriate areas and respect all traffic around them. The first several days of school will be spent educating students on the importance of safety during this time.

This is a monthly publication designed to keep parents informed of the news and activities relating to York Middle School. This issue is packed with information regarding the necessary preparations to get your student ready for the first day of school.

The York Middle School newsletter is also on-line. You will be able to access it by using the district's web-site. If you do not have access to a computer, you may sign up to continue to receive a hard copy. Details are inside this edition.

Loading and Unloading of Students Before and After School

Parent drop off and pick up is on the west (Delaware Avenue) side of the building.

Stay to the right and follow the signs. Please pull forward to the blue parking line.

Pulling forward will keep the traffic flowing and will reduce the waiting time for other parents dropping off their son/daughter.



Before and after school the streets surrounding York Middle School will become very congested, and at times, can be dangerous. We need assistance from parents to please be patient during this time and help to ensure the safety of our students!

School Hours

Supervision at York Middle School begins at 7:40 a.m. We ask that students not arrive on campus prior to that time. One staff member supervises the cafeteria. Students are welcome to congregate in that area. Once students get to YMS, they are expected to come on campus and remain there. Students enter the halls at 7:50 a.m. with classes beginning at 8:00 a.m. Dismissal is at 3:13 p.m. Students are expected to clear campus and return home as soon as school is dismissed unless they are participating in a supervised extra-curricular activity, staying after school with a teacher, or participating in the YMS After-School Clubs.

On early dismissal days, students must leave campus and return for sports practice no earlier than 3:30 p.m., *unless* the student is involved in an After-School Club.

7th Grade Physicals

State law requires that *all* seventh grade students have a physical examination by a qualified physician. Seventh grade physical forms must be turned into the YMS office by October 30, 2021 If you have any questions, please contact Sue Arnold, the school nurse, at 362-6655.

YMS ACCESS



All YMS doors will be locked during school hours, 8:00 a.m. – 3:13 p.m. Anyone wishing to enter the building will need to access the buzzer system located at the main, west entrance of YMS. This system will alert office staff. Once visitors have been identified and viewed through the video monitoring system, they will be allowed to enter.

Student-Parent Packet

Your son/daughter will be receiving their Student-Parent information at the YMS Open House on Tuesday, August 10. The information will contain your child's schedule, as well as several forms for you to fill out. In order for us to communicate effectively, as well as file reports to the state we need to make sure we have accurate, up-to-date information.

For us to do our job well, it is critical that you fill out and return all forms to the middle school. We will then go through and update the information.

School Counselor Connection August 2021

Hello York Middle School students and families. My name is Jennifer Badura and I am so excited to welcome you to the 2021-2022 school year.

I hope that you and your family have had a wonderful and relaxing summer break and are geared up for a fantastic year of learning, growth, and new experiences. Middle School is such an exciting time and it is my goal as the school counselor to help make each student's middle school experience a positive one.

This school year will be full of successful experiences, lots of learning, and the making of terrific memories. To get the year off to a good start, below are some strategies for success:

- Establish a routine and stick to it
- Get plenty of sleep. Experts say that tweens and teenagers actually need 9-10 hours of sleep every night.
- Let your middle schooler set time for homework/reading. Some may prefer doing this immediately after school and school activities while others may need a break before doing school work.
- Set priorities and goals.
- Take some time to discuss expectations for the school year.
- Be sure to revisit these goals throughout the school year.
- Stay organized
- Use a family calendar.
- Use a planner to keep track of projects, assignments, and assessments.
- Determine a designated place for academic practice (homework).
- Get clothes, school work and papers, and backpacks ready to go the night before.
- Spend time together
- Eat supper together.
- Discuss the day. Ask questions.
- Listen, listen, and listen some more.
- Find a hobby or activity that the family can do together.
- Laugh and have fun.

Welcome to the 2021-22 school year! As the first day of school approaches, I want to remind you of a few health related items:

- Students entering pre K, Kindergarten, 7th grade and students transferring from out-of-state have specific immunization/ physical and eye exam information required by the State of Nebraska. If you have questions or need more information, contact your student's school office. The completed information is to be provided prior to the first day of the school year.
- If your child has asthma, severe allergies, diabetes, seizures or other health concerns, please contact the school health office as soon as time allows, and prior to the first day of school, to review medical information for your child. Forms requesting specific information may need to be completed by you and your child's healthcare provider. **Medical information needs to be current for the school year.**
- If your student has been diagnosed with asthma or a severe allergy, and is going to carry an inhaler
 or epi-pen, a self-management form needs to be completed by parent/guardian and student, and
 physician signature is needed on the asthma/anaphylaxis form stating that student may selfadminister.
- If you have identified a food allergy for your student, there is a form that needs to be completed and is available through the food service department.
- If your child has been prescribed an epi-pen, it is requested that an epi-pen be provided for the student to be kept at school. Please consider having your child carry their epi-pen with them at all times.
- Remember that YPS is a "Nut Safe" school. Be aware of foods with nuts and nut products and remind
 your child not to share their food with other students. Check with teachers to see if there is a student
 who has a food allergy before bringing treats to school, and remind your child that eating is not
 allowed on the buses during morning and afternoon routes.
- A student diagnosed with a contagious condition such as strep throat, pink eye, impetigo, etc. will be required to have a note from the healthcare provider stating when the student may return to school.

When possible, prescribed and over the counter medication should be given at home. Your physician may be able to adjust the time schedule for a prescribed medication so that the medicine can be given at home before or after school. When a prescribed medication is to be administered at school, it needs to be in a container prepared by your pharmacist. The label on the container must include: the child's name, medication name, physician's name, current date, dosage, route and time to administer. If your physician provides samples of a prescription medication, the doctor will need to provide you with a written note including the above information if the medication will be administered at school. Any medication (prescribed or over-the-counter) must be sent in the original container or package, along with a permission form completed and signed by the parent/guardian and all medication sent to school is to be administered through the health office. Over the counter medication must be age appropriate. When sending a medication to school, please state on a written note, along with your signature/date, noting the time the last dose was given.

Rule 59 Protocol-School response to breathing emergencies

All schools in Nebraska are required to be prepared to respond to life-threatening asthma and anaphylaxis (severe allergic reaction) emergencies during the school day. The protocol directs school staff members to identify signs and symptoms of a breathing emergency and to respond. A specific team of staff members at each school are trained to carry out the protocol which includes calling 911 and administering auto-injectable epinephrine followed by nebulized albuterol while EMS is enroute. Epinephrine is a medication that acts as a bronchodilator and works to rapidly open the airway. Albuterol relaxes the bronchi and helps to open the airway and move mucus out of the lungs.

As a parent/guardian, it is your responsibility to:

- notify the school of your student's allergies/asthma
- provide written medical documentation, instructions, and medications as directed by a physician and participate in the development of the asthma/allergy action plan
- provide the school with instructions for contacting parents or other responsible adults in case of an emergency

Student responsibilities include:

- avoiding known triggers for allergies/asthma
- recognizing the need to have prescribed medication available at school and to use appropriately
- · reporting symptoms immediately to teacher/staff member/nurse

In the event that a student experiences a life threatening asthma attack or systemic allergic reaction, we will refer to the specific information/medication that has been provided by parent/guardian and student's medical provider. If there is no medical documentation on file or no previous history of asthma or anaphylaxis, the protocol will be implemented. If you have questions or concerns re: the protocol or your student's health, please contact Sue Arnold, RN or Atley Henderson, RN at the school health office.

7th Grade Well-Child Physical

All students going into 7th grade are required to have a well-child physical done by a medical doctor and be current on their immunizations per Nebraska State Law. This also is a good time to have their eyes checked by an eye doctor and see a dentist. The well-child exam can also be used if your child is going to play sports. Forms are available in the office or online at http://www.yorkpublic.org under the "Health News" tab. Most students going into 7th grade will need a Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis booster (all in one shot). Please check with your doctor if they recommend other immunizations like Meningitis, HPV or Hepatitis A. These are sometimes recommended immunizations, but not mandatory. Please turn in the copies of the physical and immunizations to the school office.

York does have an immunization clinic that asks for a small donation, but it is not required. You can schedule an appointment by calling <u>402-362-2566</u>.

School Breakfast

Breakfast is served in the dining areas of all schools before school starts. Please encourage your student to participate in school breakfast. Research studies show that eating breakfast can help students perform better in the classroom.

Second Chance Breakfast - High school and middle school students have the option of selecting this "Grab & Go" meal which includes a choice of 3 entrées daily as well as juice, fruit and milk options.

School Lunch

School lunch will offer a wide variety of choices for students. Elementary students have three entrée choices daily; Middle School students are offered six choices daily and High School students are offered twelve choices daily. All meals include an entrée choice, a hot vegetable, plus the unlimited Fruit & Veggie Bar, and milk choices.

Offer Vs. Serve

We utilize the Offer vs. Serve Program for all grade levels to provide students variety and choices in their meal service. This allows the student to decline options they do not prefer, but still provide a healthy meal that meets federal nutrition guidelines.

Extra Entrée - Extra Milk

All Students, at an extra cost, can purchase an additional entrée or milk offered as part of the school lunch program. For example, if a student wants a second entrée, or an additional entrée, like a slice of pizza, that entrée can be selected in the lunch line and charged to the student's account. Extra entrees are only sold to students who first purchase a school lunch. Again, all students can have extra servings of canned fruit, fresh fruit, vegetables and salad from the Fruit & Veggie Bar, at no charge. The fruit and veggie bar is unlimited with the purchase of a meal. We do encourage students to be good global patrons and take what they will eat during the specified meal period. If a student is free or reduced they may receive one entrée with their meal but they must have money in their account to purchase any extra entrees.

School Lunch Account

The District's Lunch Account Policy for the 2021-2022 School allows students to charge up to \$15.00. When an account balance reaches zero all a la carte purchases will **stop.** When an account reaches negative \$15.00 all purchases will **stop.** If the student qualifies for free lunch, they still will be able to purchase a school lunch, but no extra food items will be allowed.

A Point of Sale (POS) software system is used for the school lunch program. Please note the following important information:

- Each student will have his/her own individual Student Account.
- If sending cash with a student, place in a sealed envelope, along with the student's name and lunch account number.
- We are not responsible for lost, unidentified, or stolen cash. Deposits should be turned in by 9:00 a.m. at the student's school office.

Lunch Account Deposits must be made <u>before school starts</u>. To ensure that your deposit is credited to your student's lunch account on the first day of school, please send your first deposit, for each student in your family, to the office of the school your student attends. Be sure to include your name, your student's name, and your student's lunch account number. Also include any changes in your address or telephone number.

Diet Modifications

Families are responsible for notifying the School Food Service if their child requires a diet modification because of a life threatening disability. A licensed physician must provide specific written medical documentation. Free & reduced meal applications may be submitted at any time during the school year but eligibility won't apply until the application is approved. Applications can be picked-up at the administration building, at each school office, or are available online at www.yorkpublic.org. Previous eligibility will carry over to September 24, 2021. At that time, students will revert to paid status until a current Free & Reduced application has been received and approved. *If you are denied Free/Reduced status on your application, your child(ren) will still receive free meals through the federal waiver for school year 2021-2022.*

Parent Communication: New Payment Processing Vendor

Dear Parent,

On March 8, 2021, Infinite Campus announced it is switching payment processors for all online payment functions in the Campus Portal. We have chosen to make the switch on 6/17/2021. This will have minimal impact to you. However, any payment methods you've set up for your credit cards or eCheck accounts will be deleted to ensure the security and confidentiality of your data. After we make the switch, you will be asked to enter your payment methods into the Parent Portal.

There are no other changes in the way you will experience online payments. The instructions in the link below or the attached information will walk you through the process of setting up your payment methods. By using your checking or savings account instead of a credit or debit card, you will be helping YPS save money with no credit card fees.

This change will improve financial reporting efficiency for the district, as well as the support experienced by district staff when researching reported issues.

Students will not be able to charge a lunch when their account balance is below negative \$15.00. A sack lunch may be brought from home. 




