Greetings YMS Parent(s):

Well, we **marched through March** at YMS! Our **vocal music** students put on a **fantastic performance** of "High School Musical", we completed a **tornado drill**, & track **practice** got rolling. <u>8th-grade students</u> got to tour **SCC**-**Lincoln and Doane University**. We had a successful **HOPE week** that reminded our students of the <u>peer sup-</u> <u>port</u> that is available to them at YMS.

With <u>Spring Break</u> over it is time for everyone at YMS to do our **best work**. We are going to **challenge your student(s)** to do their best **in class**, **in the halls**, at **performances**, and especially on the Nebraska State **assessments**.

Speaking of those <u>state assessments</u> the name has changed. What you might have once known as <u>NeSA</u> is now called the **Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System or NSCAS**. At YMS it doesn't matter what anyone calls it, we are here to give our very best effort and we are constantly trying to **improve each and every day**.

YMS 8th grade students will be taking the <u>NSCAS Science</u> test on March 30 & 31. All 6-8 grade students will be taking the <u>NSCAS English Language Arts</u> test from April 11-14. Finally, all 6-8 grade students will be taking the <u>NSCAS Math</u> assessment on April 18-22.

Here are **a few tips** that you can **do as parents** to help ensure that your child performs to the <u>best of their ability</u> as we tackle these important tests.

- Make sure that if your child is **able to be in school** that they are **in school**. Missing these test dates will require your child to <u>miss regular instruction</u> time to make up the test, so please make sure you do **everything in your power** to have them **in school** on these days.
- Ensure that your child has **at least 9 hours of sleep** on the nights **preceding their tests**. On the morning of the tests please make sure they have **a nutritious breakfast**. Make sure you <u>remind them</u> to do their very best and that **you believe in them**.

• Encourage your child to do their best while reminding them that these tests are not "all or nothing" exams. Yes, we want all our students to do well on these exams but we are very confident in what we are doing at YMS. A <u>substandard result on a test</u> will not result in anything more than a chance for students to grow. We know that we are doing great things for kids not only academically but socially and emotionally here at YMS and that is as important as any assessment grade.

In the **fourth quarter** of football games, teams will often **hold up four fingers** to let the opposing teams know that **they "own" the fourth quarter**. At YMS are putting up our **four fingers** to let everyone know that this is the time **when we do our best work**. This is the time that we show why **we give a great effort**. This is a time we show everyone that York Middle School has the **hardest working students**, the most **dedicated staff**, and is the **best middle school in the state**.

School Counselor Connection NSCAS Growth

Although it is hard to imagine, spring really is right around the corner! And with spring comes sunshine, rain (hopefully), outdoor recess, and...state assessments!

Students will be taking the NSCAS Growth assessments. These assessments are given to all students in grades 3-8. The tests are taken on the computer. The Math and English Language Arts subject tests are adaptive in nature, which means they adjust to student responses. Students in grades 5 and 8 will also be taking the NSCAS Science assessment.

This spring students will also be taking the MAP tests for reading and math. However, beginning in the 2022-23 school year, NSCAS Growth will replace the MAP assessments for reading and math. Which means students will take the NSCAS Growth in the Fall, Winter and Spring in place of MAP Growth. This will reduce the amount of tests that students will take while also giving teachers valuable assessment information that we have come to rely on with the MAP tests.

Individual Student Results (ISR) Reports will be shared with parents next fall.

YMS will be following the testing schedule below. <u>It is very important that your child be at</u> <u>school on testing days</u> and prepared to do their best. Teachers will communicate with students which day(s) they will be taking the NSCAS Growth.

- The summer program is FREE to students that live in the York Public School Attendance Zone or attend York Public Schools
- The summer session will run from June 1 July 12, Monday thru Friday
- Holiday No Program JULY 4-5th
- The summer program will be Monday through Friday from 8 AM to 12 PM.
- Students must attend a minimum of five days during the summer.
- It will be open to the first 30 elementary students per grade level and 45 middle school students registered.
- DROP OFF AND PICKUP WILL BE AT YORK ELEMENTARY

_____July 6th - 9th: Crazy Summer Fun Camp - Every day we will be doing science experiments and learning how it happens. Playing some water sports games and delivering our Service Project.

_____July 11th - 12th: We will continue with our Crazy Summer Fun Camp. Then the last day will be a fun swimming day!

Program Description:

The summer program runs from **8:00 AM – 12:00 p.m. Monday through Friday**. Each day will include free breakfast & lunch, physical activity, academic work, educational enrichment, and an optional free lunch. Summer program students also get to experience field trips during the summer program.

Behavior Policy:

Students at York Public Schools Summer Program must be compliant with rules to provide a safe and fun environment for all students. We operate on a three-strike system. When extreme behavior occurs parents will be contacted and a strike note will be issued. Extreme behavior would include but is not limited to, spitting on others, kicking, hitting, running, or hiding from staff, injury to others, and defiant behaviors that result in an unsafe situation. Upon receiving the third strike the student will be dismissed from the YPS Summer Program.
