FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE —

ACT Test Day (and other activities) March 21, 2023

As with past school years, all juniors will be taking the State ACT test. Parents do not need to sign up their junior child and there is no fee for this test. All juniors in the state of Nebraska will be taking the ACT Test.

Testing day is Tuesday, March 21. On that same day the sophomores will be taking the Pre-ACT test, and the Freshmen will be traveling to York University for a campus visit/tour. **NO SCHOOL FOR SENIORS THAT DAY.** Students in grades 9-11 will be dismissed when their activity (testing for 10th and 11th graders, Campus tour for 9th graders) is completed. Lunch will not be served that day at YHS (breakfast will be available that morning). ****Parents (of grades 9-11), please do not make any appointments for your child on March 21.**

Career Fair, March 14

This year's YCDC Career Fair is scheduled for the morning of March 14th, at the Holthus Convention Center. Students who are currently in our JAG (Jobs for America's Graduates) classes, as well as other students, will be participating in the Career Fair. Ginger Johnson will be the guest speaker. YCDC organizes this event, and several students from all over York County will be participating as well.

Don Freeman II (Donnie) and Agri-Products donates over \$1200 worth of metal to YHS welding lab

The materials donated by Agri-Products are utilized by beginning and skilled high school welders alike. Students will utilize the metal to learn how to cut, prepare, and weld applicable joints and navigate basic blueprints. Donated metal is used by beginning welders to construct basic joints and create display boards that are entered at the county fair. Higher skilled welders have the opportunity to take dual credit courses in which they learn more specific, industry type welds and can apply a deeper meaning of welding theory. This generous donation allows students to learn hands-on, industry specific practices that will prepare them for various careers in the trades. Thanks to Agri-Products, students feel supported by the York Community and are better prepared to give back in the future.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL/ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR'S OFFICE --

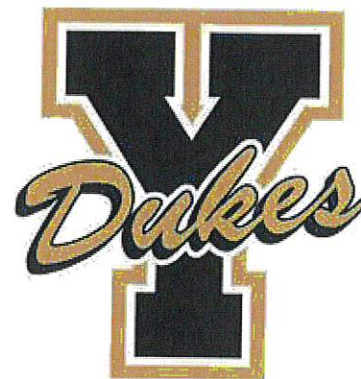
The month of March marks the beginning of the spring activity season. The spring is a busy time of year for activities and end of the year events. Here are a few reminders:

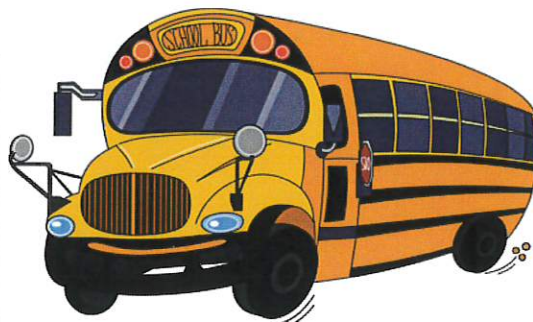

SUMMER SCHOOL CLASSES FOR CREDIT RECOVERY

Summer school classes for credit recovery will be available again this summer. This is only offered through the month of June to students who are at risk of not meeting York High School's graduation requirements. Space is limited and priority will be given to seniors and juniors. There will be a \$100 fee (per class) for making up a class. Parents of upperclassmen failing a required class will receive a letter with summer school details, as well as parents of underclassmen failing three or more classes.



JUNIORS STATE-WIDE ACT and SOPHOMORE PRE-ACT

All YHS juniors will take the ACT test at York High School on Tuesday, March 21. All YHS sophomores will take the Pre-ACT on the same day at YHS. These students will report to school between 7:30 am and 8:00 am.

ACCUPLACER TESTING

All sophomores will take the Accuplacer test at YHS. This is tentatively set for Tuesday, March 14. This is a community college entrance exam, and scores can also be used to qualify for some of our SCC dual credit courses.

DUAL CREDIT (SENCAP) THROUGH SCC

Career Academy classes through Southeast Community College are an excellent option for juniors and seniors to experience a vocational area to see if it could be a potential college interest ... or not! If your child is interested in a dual credit class or two (high school and college credit), now is the time to visit with his/her counselor. Education, health sciences, agriculture, information technology, criminal justice and green energy are just some of the areas covered in this successful program. Some courses are taught at YHS by our teaching staff and others are available online. Registrations will be starting very soon this spring, so NOW is the time to learn more!

SCAVENGER HUNT

How about a scavenger hunt for a chance to win \$500 for college? Apply by March 15 by completing a profile in ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org. If you're a Nebraska resident in grades 9-12, you'll see the EducationQuest Scavenger Hunt Scholarship as one of the scholarships for which you're eligible to apply. "Scavenge" around the EducationQuest website to find the answers to questions in a survey. A winner will be drawn from those who answer all questions correctly and this winner will receive \$500 to invest in a NEST 529 College Savings Plan account.

DUAL CREDIT - BILLING AND PAYMENTS

According to information received from SCC and Peru State, the following are the dates you need to be mindful of for dual credit billing and payments:



SCC - Bills were emailed to students on/about January 23 and February 20. Tuition payment was due February 20. As noted in the daily announcements, community colleges have received additional funding due to a legislative update. Refunds will be sent to students in March if applicable.

Peru - Bills will be mailed and emailed around March 1 to the student. Tuition payment is due April 1.

Tuition payments to both colleges should be mailed directly to the college and not to York High School. Paying online through the student's account is also an option. Contact Deb Stuhr in the Counseling office if you have any questions. Also reminder that YHS materials fees (which get turned in to Mrs. Stuhr) were due February 17.

NOTES FROM THE NURSE

Sleep awareness week is March 12-18. Maintaining your sleep health is an act of self-care. Check out the "sleep well" tips included in this newsletter.

- ◇ Keep a schedule - Staying up late and sleeping in on the weekends may sound like a great idea, however, changing your sleep habits a few days a week can have you struggling through the rest of them.
- ◇ Limit caffeine intake - Studies have shown that drinking caffeinated beverages contributes to insomnia. Try going for a quick walk outside or resting your eyes for a moment to get rejuvenated.
- ◇ Regular exercise during the day can help produce the hormone melatonin. Melatonin is a hormone found naturally in your body and it promotes good sleep.
- ◇ Have a nighttime routine - Try to leave at least 2 hours between your last meal/snack of the day and going to bed, turn off the tv, put away the phone, set the bedroom temperature between 60 and 67 degrees and spend approximately 20 minutes reading before turning off the lights.

If you or your student struggle with sleep habits, do not hesitate to speak with your healthcare professional. Sleep deprivation can have a negative impact on one's mental and physical health.

Vision, hearing and dental screenings continue for 7th and 10th grade students. If a student does not meet the screening guidelines set forth by the state, a letter recommending further evaluation will be sent to the parent/guardian. If you have concerns regarding your child's hearing, vision or dental health, please follow up with a physician / eye doctor / dentist even if you do not receive a letter of referral.

SUMMER 2023 DRIVER'S EDUCATION DATES

We are planning to offer summer driver's education again this summer at York High School. We will be offering **2 sessions**. Both sessions will be from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm. Our first session will run from **Monday, June 5th through Thursday, June 8th**. The second session will run from **Monday, June 12th through Thursday, June 15th**. Students must have a Learner's Permit (LP) or School Learner's Permit (SLP) by July 15 to be able to complete the driving portion of the class. PLEASE NOTE: Sign up is on a first come-first serve basis. If you have a special need to get into one of these sessions, please make arrangements to do so early.

Driver's Education courses will offer classroom instruction and behind-the-wheel training. The cost is \$375.00. If you are interested, please contact the high school office. **The deadline for signing up and payment will be Friday, May 5th.**

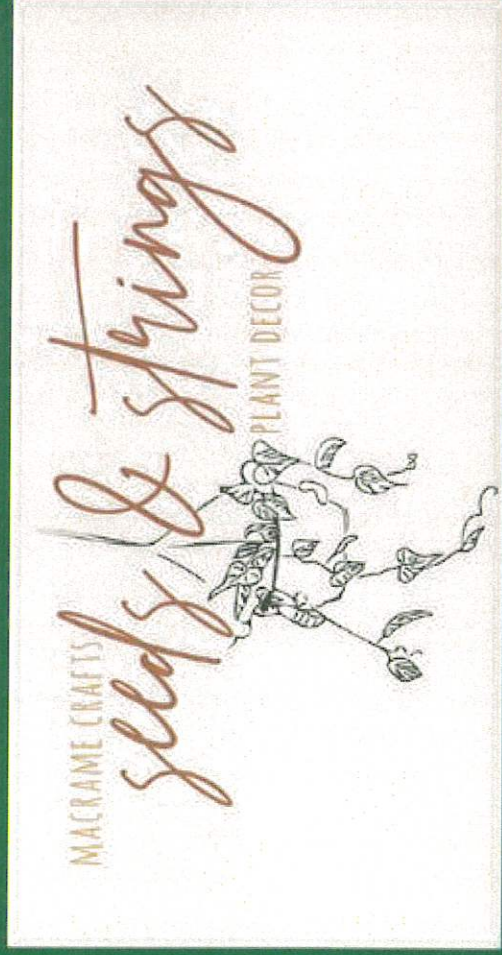
