Final exams for grades 9-11 take place May 16-19, with a noon dismissal on May 19.


BIG EVENTS FOR SENIORS


LUNCH BALANCES

Auditions for the 2023-2024 York High School Dukes & Duchesses and Chamber Singers are coming up. Don't miss out on this fun opportunity!

WHO: Anyone who will be in high school next year and is interested in trying out for Dukes and Duchesses and/or Chamber Singers.

WHERE: Auditions will take place in the high school music room. Each student audition will take about 10 minutes. You only need to audition once for D & D and Chamber Singers and you will choose if you want to audition for one or both of the groups.

WHEN: Show up any time on Tuesday, May 16th or Wednesday, May 17th from 2:00 to 5:00 pm and 6:00 to 9:00 pm. (If these times do not work for you, contact Mrs. Fraser to set up a time that works.)

WHAT TO PREPARE AND EXPECT: An audition form will be available for you to fill out right before your audition. Each student will need to prepare a chorus or verse of a song, of your choosing, to sing a cappella (have fun with this). Each student who auditions will sing My Country Tis of Thee, as well. Mrs. Fraser will also do some warm-ups with you to find out which voice part you sing.

A final list of who has made it into each group will be posted on Thursday, May 18th by the end of the school day.

What is Duke & Duchesses: D & D is a competitive show choir that does choreography, sings all kinds of music including popular, madrigal, a cappella, and much more.

What is Chamber Singers: This group is an auditioned vocal choir at the high school. This choir will learn and perform many types, styles, and genres of vocal and choral music.

END OF THE YEAR REMINDERS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Summer break is almost here! As the school year ends, there are a few details to keep in mind regarding the coming year:

- **Students transferring** to YHS from another state are required by the State of Nebraska to have a health physical and an eye exam completed within 6 months of entry, or a signed waiver. These students also need to meet the immunization requirements for the grade they are entering. Forms/information are available at the school health office and on the school website.
- Students that are going to participate in YHS athletic programs will need to have a record of a sports
 physical completed after May 1st, 2023 and prior to the start of practice for the sport. In addition to
 this, other required information includes: NSAA consent form, medical clearance form, and a health
 history form. The YHS office has packets available for pick up with the forms listed.
- If your child has asthma, severe allergies, diabetes, seizures or other health concerns, please provide current information and action plans to the school health office by the first week of August for review. Forms and action plans regarding the above concerns are available through the health office and on the website. Please call and request these forms if you do not receive one for your student at the end of this school year. These forms may require completion by your child's healthcare provider. Medical information needs to be updated at the beginning of each school year.
- If your student has been diagnosed with asthma or a severe allergy and is going to carry an inhaler
 or epipen, a completed action plan is still needed and must include a physician signature on the
 asthma/allergy action plan stating that the student may carry and self administer.
- If your student has a prescribed epipen, an epipen is to be provided by you for the student to be kept at school or to carry on them at all times.
- **No noon medication will be administered on the last day of school, Friday, May 19th.
- **If your student has a prescription medication or an over the counter medication remaining at school health office, please plan to come to the school office to pick the medication up prior to May 26, 2023. Medication needs to be picked up by an adult. Any remaining medication will be disposed of after that date.**

COUNSELING NEWS

FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

Seniors have completed a form stating where they need their **FINAL** transcripts sent, and we will send those out when all grades are entered. Seniors who took **COLLEGE COURSES** will also need to request transcripts from **Peru**, **SCC and/or NCTA to transfer those credits to their college**. The high school transcript does not qualify as documentation. There is information on the Counseling page of www.yorkpublic.org to request the Peru and SCC transcripts. NOW is the time to request these. Be sure to write "when classes are complete" on the request to the college if you are in a class this current semester.

COLLEGE PLANS AND THE ACT TEST:

Next year's seniors planning to attend ANY college should take the ACT test not only for entrance but for scholarship competition. If cost is a deterrent, FEE WAIVERS are available for those who qualify for free and reduced lunches or have other financial hardship. Each student is allotted a total of four waivers to be used for the ACT test. The counseling office can help students with this, and it is completely confidential.

Future seniors should take the JUNE, JULY, SEPTEMBER and/or OCTOBER tests if they want to try to achieve scores that would make them eligible for Honors Programs or Regents Scholarships, which have November deadlines.

The first fall test date will be in **SEPTEMBER 9th**. Registration is done online at <u>www.act.org</u> using the high school code 282-590.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

When students register for the **ACT** or **SAT** it is VERY IMPORTANT to <u>include our high school code (282-590)</u> to ensure that we receive a copy of the score for their transcript. If the score is not on the transcript, colleges will require the score be sent directly from ACT. ACT charges a fee for this service, per college. This code is also on the school website at www.yorkpublic.org

PLEASE NOTE: UNL and UNO no longer accept scores from high schools, they must be sent directly from ACT so it's important to record the UNL code (2482) and/or UNO code (2464) on the ACT registration if considering UNL or UNO.

NCAA AND NAIA: If considering playing college sports, scores must be sent directly to the NCAA and NAIA, as well. These codes, NCAA: 9999 or the NAIA: 9876, must be recorded in the college choice section of the ACT registration form. Remember to also register online with the NCAA and/or the NAIA. This is a separate step you need to take to be ready to play college sports. Students can do this in their junior year AND must let the counseling office know so they can send your transcript to these places.

COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID

Juniors should start their college planning soon. The EducationQuest Foundation, with locations in Kearney, Lincoln and Omaha, will help you plan your education path. The following online information can also help you with the planning process and can be accessed by visiting their website at www.educationquest.org.

College Selection Service - This program suggests schools that match your interests and

needs.

College Funding Estimator - This program estimates your federal financial aid eligibility and aids in filling out the FAFSA later.

Scholarship Search - This will provide you with a list of private scholarships for which you may qualify. (Check this list during the summer months as some scholarships have very early deadlines.)

SUMMER SCHOOL CLASSES REMINDER

Summer School will be held at the York Public Schools High School Enrichment Center May 22 – June 2, 2023, to retrieve and/or make-up credits failed or not completed during the school term 2022-2023. There will be one session each day at the YHS Enrichment Center, 9:00 am to 12:00 noon. YHS students failing a first semester required course and qualifying for summer school will receive a letter and enrollment form to be filled out and returned to the counseling office as soon as possible. The fee for summer school is \$100 or a waiver if your family qualifies for free/reduced lunch program.







The York Duke Youth Football organization will once again make Pee Wee tackle football available to all boys in grades 4th-6th in the 2023-24 school year. The York Duke Pee Wee tackle football team will be a competitive youth football team that will compete once again in the Farmers Valley football league.

Even though this is a competitive league a very high stress will be placed on player safety, FUN, and character development. The main goal that our coaches have is to help the child develop a love of football and make them want to play again next year. This team will also be using the same schemes that the York high school and Jr high teams run, so it will prepare them for high school and Jr high football very well.
