

K-12 STUDENT ACTIVITY PASSES

The K-12 student activity passes is a means whereby students may purchase one ticket at a greatly reduced price to attend many functions at York High School and York Middle School (with the exception of tournaments and away contests). These activity tickets are available at each school at a cost of \$15.00 for the school year. This is a substantial savings for students since student admission prices for home contests will be the same as the rest of the Central Conference schools which is \$4.00.

GOLDEN AGE PASS

SENIOR OPEN CAMPUS PERIOD

For many years YHS has provided seniors with the opportunity for a release period each day. If a senior chooses to take a study hall during one or both semesters, they have the privilege of leaving district grounds and returning shortly before the next period begins. If a senior chooses to stay in the building, they must be directly supervised and communicate with the study hall supervisor. Seniors who are experiencing academic difficulties will lose their Senior Open Campus period until the situation is rectified.

A Consent Form will be given to the Seniors which requires a parent's signature and a student's signature. This form <u>MUST</u> be turned in to the YHS office <u>PRIOR</u> to the student leaving the school grounds during study hall.

STUDENT RECORDS

Current State and Federal laws require that we provide students and parents specific information about our policies and procedures. We are also required to inform parents/guardians each year that student records are open. For a thorough explanation of all of the test data and other information that is included in the student's permanent record, a request for a conference to see these records should be submitted to the Guidance Office in order that a conference might be arranged to discuss these records. A Federal Law. PRIVACY RIGHT OF PARENTS AND STUDENTS, reauires each school release to certain information to the public when requested by the 'press." On such occasions, it will be the policy of York High School to release the following types of information regarding our students: PARENTS' NAME, ADDRESS, PREVIOUS SCHOOL(S) ATTENDED, AGE, GRADE LEVEL, **AWARDS** RECEIVED, ACTIVITY PARTICIPATION, WEIGHT AND HEIGHT (WHEN APPROPRIATE), AND POST GRADUATE PLANS. Each parent/guardian has the right to request the school not to release such information about his/her son/daughter. If this is a request you wish to make, please complete the appropriate form included in this mailing and return it to the Principal's Office as soon as possible.

LUNCH PERIOD

Please note the following:

- The lunch room computer will give the cashier a "low balance" warning whenever a student's individual account is \$5.00 or below.
- Balance Below \$5.00: Students are told the account balance is low and they need to bring money.
- Students will not be able to charge a lunch when their account is below NEGATIVE \$15.00.
- It is the student's responsibility to inform parents when the account is getting low. Both verbal and written reminders will be provided to students when the account is low.
- Parents and/or students can check their account balance by calling the Food Service Office or by checking Infinite Campus on the YPS website at www.yorkpublic.org.
- Please keep in mind that extra entrees and a la carte items can only be purchased if funds are available in individual accounts.



Rule 59 Protocol-School Response to Breathing Emergencies

All schools in Nebraska are required to be prepared to respond to life-threatening asthma and anaphylaxis (severe allergic reaction) emergencies during the school day. The protocol directs school staff members to identify signs and symptoms of a breathing emergency and to respond. A specific team of staff members at each school are trained to carry out the protocol which includes calling 911 and administering auto-injectable epinephrine followed by nebulized albuterol while EMS is enroute. Epinephrine is a medication that acts as a bronchodilator and works to rapidly open the airway. Albuterol relaxes the bronchi and helps to open the airway and move mucus out of the lungs.

As a parent/guardian, it is your responsibility to:

- notify the school of your student's allergies/asthma
- provide written medical documentation, instructions, and medications as directed by a physician and participate in the development of the asthma/allergy action plan
- provide the school with instructions for contacting parents or other responsible adults in case of an emergency

Student responsibilities include:

- avoiding known triggers for allergies/asthma
- recognizing the need to have prescribed medication available at school and to use appropriately
- Reporting symptoms immediately to teacher/staff member/nurse

In the event that a student experiences a life threatening asthma attack or systemic allergic reaction, we will refer to the specific information/medication that has been provided by parent/guardian and student's medical provider. If there is no medical documentation on file or no previous history of asthma or anaphylaxis, the protocol will be implemented. If you have questions or concerns regarding the protocol or your student's health, please contact Sue Arnold, RN or Atley Henderson, RN at the school health office.

STUDENT PARKING

STUDENT DRIVING AND PARKING

Students who elect to drive to school will be expected to park on campus in the north, east, or southeast lots. PARKING IMMEDIATELY IN THE FRONT OF THE BUILD-ING (SOUTH SIDE) IS PRIMARLY FOR FACULTY AND STAFF. Students are not to park in handicapped zones or in fire lanes and may lose their driving/parking/open campus privileges indefinitely if they choose to do so.

COUNSELING CENTER NEWS

NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION / SCHEDULE CHANGES

New students to the York School District are encouraged to register on Tuesday and Wednesday, August 1 and 2, from 8:30 am - 3:00 pm. This will be held at York High School Counseling Office. Also, students who need to change schedules are welcome to come to YHS during these times to update their plans. A parent must accompany his/her student or a letter or email from a parent approving the schedule changes is required. Students can also just simply email their counselor to make a schedule change.

ACT / SAT

Seniors and juniors are always strongly encouraged to take the ACT test even if their plans do not include a four year college at this time. We urge students to take every opportunity to keep their options open for a four-year college or scholarships for which they thought they might not be eligible. This four-year college entrance test can also be used for community colleges in place of the Accuplacer test. Although it is not a free test, the benefits in scholarship money may outweigh the cost. Even community colleges ask for an ACT score on scholarship applications and offer some scholarships based on their ACT score. Students can apply for a fee waiver if cost is a factor. (This is done with Mrs. Stuhr.) Parents will need to complete a Free/Reduced Lunch application form to see if they qualify. (SAT test scores are accepted as well as ACT scores).

The Counseling Office recommends taking the September and/or October tests to ensure that scores will be calculated in time to meet scholarship deadlines. Some colleges have December 1 deadlines. Private colleges may accept later scores on an individual basis. Below are dates for these ACT and SAT tests:

ACT - September 9 — Regular Registration Deadline: August 4 ACT - October 28 — Regular Registration Deadline: September 22

Students should apply online at www.actstudent.org Students will also need to upload a close-up photo and print an "admission ticket" prior to the testing date. If you need assistance with this, we can help. Always remember to include the school code (282-590) so that the high school will receive the scores, as well, to add to transcripts.

REMINDERS:

1. UNL (code 2482) and UNO (2464) only accept ACT scores sent directly to them from ACT. Please include these on your registration if considering these colleges.

2. Students hoping to play college sports will need to choose the NCAA (9999) or NAIA (9876) on their registration as college choices.

Interested students should either check the website at www.collegeboard.com or see the counseling office when school begins for additional testing dates or for questions.

COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID

Juniors and seniors should start their college financial planning now. The EducationQuest Foundation website at www.educationquest.com can assist you with the following computer programs to help you plan your education path:

College Selection Service suggests schools that match your interests and needs. **College Funding Estimator** estimates your federal financial aid eligibility. **Scholarship Search** lists private scholarships for which you may qualify. (This list can be requested during the summer months as some scholarships have very early deadlines.)

DUAL CREDIT REGISTRATION

Juniors and seniors registering for dual credit (college and high school credit) classes through Peru **State College** will note the following rates: \$60 per credit hour. There is also a \$35 per class charge for materials payable to York High School. All of this will be reviewed with students impacted.

Juniors and seniors registering for dual credit (college and high school credit) classes through **Southeast Community College** will note the following rates: \$42.35 per credit hour as well as a \$35 per class (\$50 for chemistry) charge for materials payable to York High School. Many of the students completed their registrations prior to the last school year ending, and we will follow up with those not yet registered in the very near future.

<u>FAFSA – OPENING DAY IS OCTOBER 1!</u>

Families of seniors have the ability and are encouraged to complete the FAFSA in the fall instead of waiting until after taxes in the spring. We invite you to connect with EducationQuest at the above-listed numbers to set an appointment with them to receive FREE assistance with this important form. Moving this timeline up will greatly help many students and families with scholarships in the spring.



PSAT TESTING COMING SOON

We will be administering the PSAT test on October 11 to students in 10th and 11th grades who have pre-registered in the Counseling office and paid the \$18 fee. It is good practice for 10th graders, and 11th graders who score highly may be eligible for a National Merit Scholarship. If your student is in the top 5-10% of the class, you should strongly consider this. Watch the high school daily announcements for details closer to this date, and feel free to call our office if questions.

CAMPUS VISITS

As of this writing, we plan to move forward with our campus visits as we've done in the past (juniors to UNK, sophomores to Wayne State, and freshmen to York College). Seniors are encouraged to use their TWO EXEMPT days to make campus visits with a parent or family member. There may be a few other "special interest" groups that will make other visits, and these opportunities will be communicated with students.

NOTES FROM THE SCHOOL HEALTH OFFICE

As the first day of school approaches, I want to remind you of a few health related items:

• Students entering Pre K, Kindergarten, 7th grade and students transferring from out-of-state have specific immunization / physical and eye exam information required by the State of Nebraska. If you have questions or need more information, contact your student's school office. The completed information is to be provided prior to the first day of the school year.



- If your child has asthma, severe allergies, diabetes, seizures or other health concerns, please contact the school health office prior to the first week of school, to review medical information for your child. Forms requesting specific information may need to be completed by you and your child's healthcare provider. **Medical information needs to be current for the school year.**
- If your student has been diagnosed with asthma or a severe allergy, and is going to carry an inhaler or epi-pen, a self-management form needs to be completed by parent/guardian and student, and a physician signature is needed on the asthma/anaphylaxis form stating that student may self-administer.
- If you have identified a food allergy for your student, there is a form that needs to be completed and is available through the food service department.
- If your child has been prescribed an epi-pen, it is requested that an epi-pen be provided for the student to be kept at school. Please consider having your child carry their epi-pen with them at all times.

When possible, prescribed and over the counter medication should be given at home. Your physician may be able to adjust the time schedule for a prescribed medication so that the medicine can be given at home before or after school. When a prescribed medication is to be administered at school, it needs to be in a container prepared by your pharmacist. The label on the container must include: the child's name, medication name, physician's name, current date, dosage, route and time to administer. If your physician provides samples of a prescription medication, the doctor will need to provide you with a written note including the above information if the medication will be administered at school. Any medication (prescribed or over-the-counter) must be sent in the original container or package, along with a permission form completed and signed by the parent/guardian and all medication sent to school is to be administered through the health office. Over the counter medication must be age appropriate. When sending a medication to school, please note the time that the most recent dose was given, along with your signature/date.

Thank you for your cooperation with the above. Please contact your school health office regarding any questions. Happy August!

A Medication Permission Form is to be signed by the parent or guardian and returned to the school if you would like your student to be able to receive Acetaminophen, without you being contacted, for minor health concerns. This form is available in the YHS Office and attached to this newsletter.

York Public Schools

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. York Public Schools offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.60; lunch costs \$3.20 at York Elementary School, and \$3.30 at York High School and York Middle School. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. If your child(ren) qualified for free or reduced price meals at the end of last school year, you must submit a new application by September 27, 2023 in order to avoid an interruption in meal benefits.

This packet includes an application for free or reduced price meal benefits and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

- 1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?
 - All children in households receiving benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) are eligible for free meals.
 - Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
 - Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
 - Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
 - Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits
 on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price
 meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.
- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail York Public Schools, Dr. Mitch Bartholomew, 402-362-6655, Option 4; mitch.bartholomew@yorkdukes.org.
- 3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: Carol Faller, 1715 N Delaware Avenue, York, NE 68467.
- 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact Carol Faller, York Public Schools, 402-362-6655, Option 4; carol.faller@yorkdukes.org immediately.
- 5. CAN I APPLY ONLINE? You are encouraged to complete an online application instead of a paper application <u>if</u> your school district makes this option available. The online application has the same requirements and will ask you for the same information as the paper application. **N/A**.
- 6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year. If you do not send in a new application that is approved by the school or you have not been notified that your child is eligible for free meals, your child will be charged the full price for meals.

7. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.

- 8. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
- 9. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 10. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: **Dr. Mitch Bartholomew**, 1715 N Delaware Avenue, York, NE 68467; 402-362-6655, Option 4; mitch.bartholomew@yorkdukes.org.
- 11. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced price meals.
- 12. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you <u>normally</u> receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 13. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will also be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.
- 14. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.
- 15. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper, and attach it to your application. Contact Carol Faller, 1715 N Delaware Avenue, York, NE 68467; 402-362-6655, Option 4; carol.faller@yorkdukes.org to receive a second application.
- 16. MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for SNAP or other assistance benefits, please go online to ACCESSNebraska.ne.gov or call 1-800-383-4278.

Instructions for Completing the Free & Reduced Price School Meals Family Application

For households receiving benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), follow these instructions:

Part 1: List each child's name, the school they attend and their grade.

Part 2: Enter household's Master Case Number if the household qualifies for SNAP, TANF or FDPIR.

Part 3: Skip this part.

Part 4: Complete this part. An adult must sign the form.

Part 5: This part is optional and does not affect your children's eligibility for free or reduced price meals. If you do not select race or ethnicity, one may be selected based on visual observation.

For households with FOSTER, HOMELESS, MIGRANT or RUNAWAY CHILDREN, follow these instructions:

If all children in the household are foster children:

Part 1: List all foster children, the school they attend and their grade. Check the box indicating the child is a foster child.

Part 2: Skip this part. Part 3: Skip this part.

Part 4: Complete this part. An adult must sign the form.

Part 5: This part is optional and does not affect your children's eligibility for free or reduced price meals. If you do not select race or ethnicity, one may be selected based on visual observation.

If some of the children in the household are foster children or are homeless, migrant or runaway children:

Part 1: List all children, the school they attend and their grade. Check the appropriate box.

Part 2: If the household does not have a Master Case Number, skip this part.

Part 3: Follow these instructions to report total household income from last month.

Column 1 – Household Members: List the first and last name of **each** person living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives or friends) who share income and expenses. Attach another sheet of paper if necessary.

Column 2 - Gross Income and How Often it was Received: Gross income is the amount earned <u>before</u> taxes and other deductions; it is not your take-home pay. For each household member, list each type of income received for the month. You must also report how often the money is received – weekly, every other week, twice a month, or monthly.

Earnings from Work includes the following:

- · Salary, wages, cash bonuses
- Net income from self-employment (farm or business)

If you are in the U.S. Military, include:

- Basic pay and cash bonuses (do not include combat pay, Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance (FSSA) payments or privatized housing allowances)

Do not include income from SNAP, FDPIR, WIC, Federal education benefits and foster care payments.

Pensions/Retirement/All Other Income includes the following:

- · Private pensions or Disability benefits
- Regular income from trusts or estates, Annuities, Investment income, Earned interest, Rental income and Regular cash payments received from outside the household.

If you have no income, write "0" or leave the income field blank. By doing this, you are certifying there is no income to report.

Household Size: Enter the total number of people in your household.

Social Security Number: The adult signing the form must list the last four digits of their Social Security Number (SSN) or check the box to the right labeled "Check if no SSN."

Part 4: Complete this part. An adult must sign the form.

Part 5: This part is optional and does not affect your children's eligibility for free or reduced price meals. If you do not select race or ethnicity, one may be selected based on visual observation.

Please note: Children who meet the definition of homeless, migrant or runaway, are eligible for free meals. However, the school district must have documentation on file from a migrant coordinator, homeless/runaway liaison or the district's Direct Certification list to approve the child for free meals.

For ALL other households, follow these instructions:

Part 1: List all children, the school they attend and their grade.

Part 2: If the household does not have a Master Case Number, skip this part.

Part 3: Follow these instructions to report total household income from last month.

Column 1 – Household Members: List the first and last name of **each** person living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives or friends) who share income and expenses. Attach another sheet of paper if necessary.

Column 2 - Gross Income and How Often it was Received: Gross income is the amount earned <u>before</u> taxes and other deductions; it is not your take-home pay. 



School Lunch Account

The District's Lunch Account Policy for the 2023-2024 School year allows students to charge up to \$15.00. When an account balance reaches zero all a la carte purchases will **stop.** When an account reaches negative \$15.00 all purchases will **stop.** If the student qualifies for free lunch, they still will be able to purchase a school lunch, but no extra food items will be allowed.

A Point of Sale (POS) software system is used for the school lunch program. Please note the following important information:

- Each student will have his/her own individual Student Account.
- If sending cash with a student, place in a sealed envelope, along with the student's name and lunch account number.
- We are not responsible for lost, unidentified, or stolen cash.

Deposits should be turned in by <u>9:00 a.m.</u> at the student's school office.

Lunch Account Deposits must be made <u>before school starts</u>. To insure that your deposit is credited to your student's lunch account on the first day of school, please send your first deposit, for each student in your family, to the office of the school your student attends. Be sure to include your name, your student's name, and your student's lunch account number. Also include any changes in your address or telephone number.

DIET MODIFICATIONS

Families are responsible for notifying the School Food Service if their child requires a diet modification because of a life threatening disability. A licensed physician must provide specific written medical documentation.

A Medication Permission Form is to be signed by the parent or guardian and returned to the school if you would like your student to be able to receive Acetaminophen, without you being contacted, for minor health concerns. By signing and returning this form, we will be able to administer Acetaminophen pain reliever to your student for an occasional headache or other mild discomfort. A current form is required for each new school year. Without this form, the school cannot give your student acetaminophen without contacting you for permission. If this permission form is completed, the school may also provide as needed: generic antibiotic ointment, generic chewable antacid tabs, and generic anti-itch lotion. Please notify the nurse should you not want these medications to be given to your student.

All efforts should be made for students to take routine medication at home. If your student needs to take prescription or non-prescription medication at school, this medication must be brought to the office by an adult. This medication must be in its original packaging and accompanied by the appropriate permission form completed by the parent/guardian as to how/when it should be administered.

A health history questionnaire is located on the reverse side of this form. Please complete the health history portion and return to the school health office even if you choose not to complete the Acetaminophen permission form.

If your student has a chronic health condition such as Asthma, Life-Threatening Allergy, Seizures, Diabetes or any other health concern that may impact your student's school day, please contact the nurse by email or phone during the weeks prior to the first day of school so that medical information may be reviewed. This information will assist us in coordinating care for your student during the time that he/she is at school.





Weather Related Emergency School Closing Procedures

In case of a weather emergency, we will follow the same procedure that has been in practice in the past years. That procedure is as follows:

- 1. Radio Station KOOL (103.5 FM 1370 AM), and KTMX-FM (104.9) will again serve as our primary source for dispensing "school closing information." They are 24 hour stations.
- 2. If severe weather necessitates an early dismissal, a school cancellation, or information concerning school buses, it will be broadcast on KOOL and KTMX.
- 3. Bus drivers are instructed to use good judgment in determining whether a road is passable. The Transportation Department will notify parents where children can be loaded if a specific road cannot be traveled. Buses will travel the regular routes and maintain a time schedule consistent with the conditions of the roads.
- 4. "Emergency Messages" will be sent to our student's parents and guardians who have an email or cell phone number listed in Infinite Campus, and the YPS Staff. Information will be posted on our website at www.yorkpublic.org, on our Facebook page at York Public Schools and on Twitter at @MitchBartYPS (#yorkdukes). Parents and Guardians please be sure to provide the school secretaries with your current email address and cell phone number in order to be notified!!

FILE: EBBDA POLICY ON SCHOOL DISMISSAL FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER

The York Public Schools will be closed, when in the determination of the Superintendent of Schools or his/her designee, the weather conditions constitute a hazard for students going to or from school.

When regular morning school bus routes cannot be run due to road conditions, yet travel in town is not seriously hampered, school may remain open. When possible a "limited service" bus route shall be run anytime school remains open and it is not possible to run regular routes.

The starting time of the morning session may be delayed when necessary.

When, during the school day and while school is in session, it is necessary to send bus pupils home early, school may be dismissed for all students.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ON SCHOOL DISMISSAL FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER

When school is not held or is dismissed early due to poor weather conditions, notification will be placed on the York radio station and any other such means as the superintendent may deem necessary and feasible.

When it is necessary to dismiss school due to inclement weather after the school day has started, all students should be accounted for in their homeroom by their homeroom teachers. Bus students should be dismissed first. Teachers shall be responsible for their assigned students. Before dismissing elementary town students, the teachers shall not let any student who has been transported to school go home without contacting their parents, unless they are sure other arrangements have been made. Students who have walked to school may be allowed to walk home if the teacher feels the weather does not present a hazard. Teachers will be dismissed when all of their students have been accounted for.
