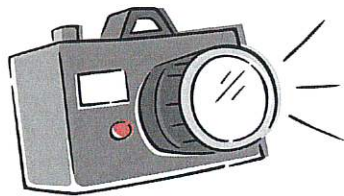

## 2024 ONE-ACT PRODUCTION

Duke One-Act is in full swing at the high school! The cast and crew for the York One-Act are venturing back to the 1950's this season with their production of *Rebel Without A Cause* By James Fuller from the screenplay by Stewart Stern. The play adaptation is by Irving Shulman from a story by Nicholas Ray. The NSAA play production adaptation was written by Becky Stahr with permission from Dramatic Publishing.

*Rebel Without a Cause* explores the lives of rebellious, troubled teenagers in 1950's suburban America, offering a powerful commentary on the emotional struggles and societal pressures faced by youth. The play captures themes of alienation, identity, and the desire for belonging. After moving to a new town, troublemaking teen Jim Stark (Charles Van Gomple) is supposed to have a clean slate, although being the new kid in town brings its own problems. While searching for some stability, Stark forms a bond with a disturbed classmate, Plato (Ava Goodwin), and falls for local girl Judy Brown (Madelyn Miller). However, Judy is the girlfriend of the neighborhood tough guy Buzz Gunderson (Brody Booth). When Buzz violently confronts Jim and challenges him to a drag race, the new kid's real troubles begin. This tragedy deepens the emotional turmoil for Jim, Judy, and Plato, as they attempt to navigate the fallout. They retreat to an abandoned mansion, where they momentarily play at the idea of forming a family unit away from the pressures of society. However, their brief respite is shattered when the gang (Daniel Rivera, Carlye Philipp, Greysen Algaier, Taylor Peters, Jack Chavanu, Nell Chavanu, Isaiah Kreifels, Maggie McCarthy, Melissa Eckhart, Alexis Davis, Lael Schwarz), seeking revenge for Buzz's death, tracks them down, leading to a climactic confrontation.

Officer Fremick (Carter Heath), the police officer who interacts with the town's high school population, represents a rare source of adult compassion and understanding. Detective Taylor Mullens (Gage Stahr) and the police department (Rory Huber, Luke Holthe, Gavin Fowler, Connor Krausnick, Braylen Arnold, Ethan Dodsens, Varian Sterns, and Kai Epp) are frustrated with the behavior of these rebellious teens, making their jobs harder. Frank Stark (Peter Dallmann), Carol Stark (Jaimey Rinehart), and Grandma Louise Stark (Maelynn Ericson) show the generational divide through a dysfunctional family dynamic that drives much of Jim's emotional turmoil. They are portrayed as an example of the generation gap and a failure to provide the stability or understanding that Jim needs. Judy's relationship with her parents Evelyn Brown (Emily Otoupal) and William Brown (Mason Johnston) is another important aspect of the play's portrayal of parental failure. Her father is emotionally distant, particularly rejecting her when she seeks affection. Her mother wants to keep the peace and completely ignores all of the family's problems. Plato's parents are notably absent from her life. Her father has abandoned the family, and her mother is often away, leaving her in the care of a housekeeper (Hannah Doremus). This lack of parental involvement leaves Plato lonely, emotionally neglected, and vulnerable, which is why she clings to Jim and Judy as parental figures. Plato's tragic fate underscores the play's theme of how the absence or failure of parents can lead to deep emotional trauma in children.

The show was directed and adapted for the stage by Becky Stahr, Paige Manley, and Clare Bierbaum. The acting stage managers are Nell Chavanu and Taylor Peters. Our acting captains are Charlie Van Gomple, Brody Booth, and Ava Goodwin. Live music is under the direction of Madelyn Miller and Jack Chavanu. Sound and light design is led by Marco Iniquez and Ike Colburn. Scenic design is led by Kadin Tesar and Chris Trejo as the crew stage managers. Our crew captains are Rubi Trejo, Carson Buller, and Bethany Lingo. Hair and makeup designs are led by Yanesi Gallegos and Sophia Becker. Promotions are led by Hannah Doremus, Melissa Eckhart, and Alexis Davis. Our costume captains are Maelynn Ericson and Carlye Philipp. The props captains are Riley Snider and Angellie Ibarra. The dance captain is Jada Scamehorn. Ensemble captains are Maggie McCarthy and Emily Otoupal. Gage Stahr and Audrey Miller are the JV captains. The team is working hard to lead over 100 students in this year's one-act production. The show does contain a strong subject matter, simulated weapons, loud sound effects, fog, and strobe lighting. It will be thirty minutes long.

The one-act program could not be more excited to start our competition season in November. The cast and crew have already learned a lot by studying this historical time period and have been working hard since August. They cannot wait to bring this story to life on the stage! The one-act team would love to have the York community come out and support our team members at every contest and performance possible. Thank you all for your continued support of our team. # COUNSELING NEWS

**IMPORTANT DATE: ACT TEST** - December 14

**REGISTRATION DEADLINE** - November 8

**NOTE:** Seniors, this may be the last ACT test you could take to have scores available in time for freshmen scholarship consideration offered by MOST colleges. Of course some of these circumstances have changed due to COVID 19. Check with your college choice to determine their scholarship deadline and requirements. Registration online at [www.act.org](http://www.act.org)

**When registering for the ACT test it is VERY IMPORTANT to include:**

- **The York High School code (282-590) to ensure we receive the score for the transcript and your file.**
- **UNL or UNO as one of your choices if they are in your plans at all. UNL and UNO will only accept scores directly from the testing center (ACT or SAT). UNL ACT College Code is 2482 and UNO ACT College Code is 2464.**
- **The NCAA or NAIA as one of your college choices if planning to play college sports. NCAA code is 9999. NAIA code is 9876.**
- **The codes for FOUR colleges you may be interested in. Failure to record these codes will mean you will have to order scores later, directly from ACT, and pay a fee for each score that is sent per college.**

## **NEBRASKA SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**

Students planning to attend Peru, Wayne or Chadron State Colleges should plan to apply for the Board of Trustees Full-Tuition scholarships if they score at least a 25 on the ACT and can provide one letter of recommendation. The UNL Davis/Chambers Scholarship is offered for students with financial need, and the deadline is February 1.

## **TUITION REDUCTION PROGRAMS**

Various two and four-year colleges and universities in Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, and Missouri participate in the Midwest Student Exchange Program which reduces tuition to in-state cost. Missouri Western State University in St. Joseph, Missouri, offers the Western Neighboring State Scholarship which provides in-state tuition scholarships to students from Nebraska, Kansas, Illinois or Iowa. Seniors may pick up information in the Counseling Office if interested in either of these programs.

# COUNSELING NEWS

## WAITING LIST REMINDER

Some community and vocational/technical schools may have waiting lists for students who wish to enter certain programs. Some programs could have up to a one-year waiting list. To be placed on a waiting list, a student must take the Accuplacer test, apply for admission, and be accepted into the program. Sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are interested in vocational and technical areas are encouraged to visit the Counseling Office as soon as possible to begin this process and/or check with your college to ask about the related time frame for interests. Remember when applying to still select your preferred starting date as there are sometimes last-minute cancellations by others ahead of you.

## PSAT TEST RESULTS

The PSAT test was digital this year. Students should watch their email for results. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Counseling Office.

## ASVAB TESTING

ASVAB testing will happen at YHS on Wednesday, November 13 for **all** sophomores. There is no charge for this test. This test is a great interest/strengths analysis. Juniors and seniors who indicate an interest in the military may sign up in the counseling office in advance to test as well. Score interpretation will be on Tuesday, November 19.

## SENIOR COLLEGE VISITS



Your senior has two exempt absence days to use for college visits. We encourage students to use these days to step foot on campuses in which they are interested to get a true feeling of life there. Most of the colleges have a page on their website to set up the visit yourself. If you need assistance setting up these visits, please call Mrs. Stuhr in the counseling office. We'll be glad to help make this happen.

## SUSAN T. BUFFETT SCHOLARSHIP

The Susan T. Buffett scholarship application opens November 1. This scholarship can be used at any Nebraska community college, state college or university. Seniors must have a 2.0 GPA and have financial need. Check it out at [buffettscholarships.org](http://buffettscholarships.org). The deadline is **February 1, 2025, at 5 pm**. The FAFSA Submission Summary (formerly called Student Aid Report) must be submitted by March 15, 2025.

## FAFSA HELP

Just a reminder that EducationQuest staff are willing to offer FREE help to assist parents in completing the FAFSA and/or answering any college financial or scholarship questions. We are so fortunate to have our OWN EducationQuest representative coming to York High School to help! Contact Mrs. Stuhr in the Counseling office if you'd like to set up an in-person appointment with Ms. Brown. You are certainly welcome to also set up your own appointment at one of their offices. They have offices in Lincoln, Omaha, and Kearney. They are doing in person OR virtual appointments. Get your appointment set up soon as they are booking quickly! Take note: this year the **FAFSA is REQUIRED** for all seniors to complete.



## ELEVENTH, TENTH and NINTH GRADERS REGISTERING

Eleventh and tenth grade students will work individually with their counselors in November and early December to get registered for their senior and junior year classes and review their four-year plans. Current freshmen will follow. Prior to this, each student is encouraged to look at the list of courses available which are on the school website. # NOTES FROM THE SCHOOL HEALTH OFFICE

National Stress Awareness Day is November 6<sup>th</sup>. This day is a reminder to think about the variety of stressors that all of us encounter, how the effects can be positive or negative, and things we can do to reduce the mental and physical impact of minor stress.

Stress is a normal experience for everyone. Sometimes stress can be useful when it motivates us to get something done or helps us to make a change that we have been wanting to make. Other times, stress can pile up and make it seem difficult for us to cope.

Some at-home stress coping strategies can include: practicing a regular bedtime routine and getting enough sleep, daily physical exercise, eating regular and healthy meals, limiting caffeine and finding time for relaxation and fun in the day.

Managing stress can be hard. Talking about stress is sometimes difficult. If you are struggling or have concerns for another person, speak to a trusted friend/family member and seek out help from a healthcare provider or mental health professional.

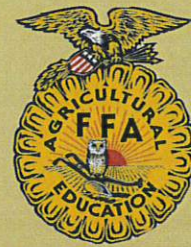

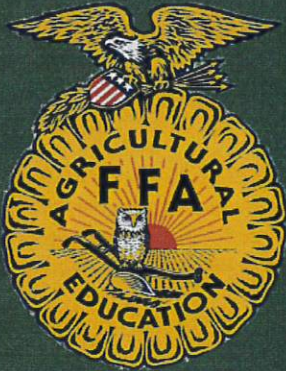

# I'M SO STRESSED OUT!

## Is it stress or anxiety?

### Stress

- Generally is a response to an *external* cause, such as taking a big test or arguing with a friend.
- Goes away once the situation is resolved.
- Can be positive or negative. For example, it may inspire you to meet a deadline, or it may cause you to lose sleep.

### Both Stress and Anxiety

Both stress and anxiety can affect your mind and body. You may experience symptoms such as:

- Excessive worry
- Uneasiness
- Tension
- Headaches or body pain
- High blood pressure
- Loss of sleep

### Anxiety

- Generally is *internal*, meaning it's your reaction to stress.
  - Usually involves a persistent feeling of apprehension or dread that doesn't go away, and that interferes with how you live your life.
- Is constant, even if there is no immediate threat.

## Ways to Cope

- Keep a journal.
- Download an app with relaxation exercises.
- Exercise and eat healthy.
- Get regular sleep.
- Avoid excess caffeine.
- Identify and challenge your negative thoughts.
- Reach out to your friends or family.

## Find Help

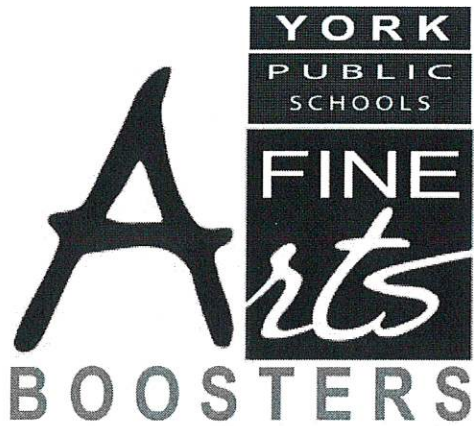

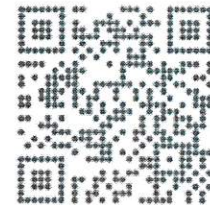


